### M & M's

It is good to be back home after spending a week with the priests and bishops from the Archdiocese of Detroit in our convocation that meets every other year. 270 priests were there and we had some good discussions on the church and on our working together as a group of priests with a document titled "Total Pastoral Plan for Priests" in the Archdiocese of Detroit. The document covers all aspects of priestly life and spirituality with what is happening right now and what we need to look for ward to for the future. It will still take a few years to get it all working as a plan and a reality, but it is a beginning. I then drove down to Miami, Florida the following week, stopping at different places along the way to visit some family and friends that I have not seen for awhile. It was a good and relaxing time. But it is good to be back here in the Cayman's.

Cardinal Maida has informed me that he will be coming down to the Islands next February to visit the parish of St. Ignatius and Christ the Redeemer, and will also be sharing in the sacrament of confirmation for our young students in the parish. At the moment he will be here from the 15th of February to the 21st of February 2006. Although it is possible that this will change because of his schedule and not knowing what will happen at the Vatican between now and then. As a Cardinal he is often called to the Vatican for special meetings and he has to change plans rather quickly. Although he did assure me that as of right now nothing is scheduled for him to be gone during that time in February. So we will hope that it all works out and that he can return for a visit here in our Islands.

I want to thank Fr. Alphonsus for his willingness to fill in for me as a vacation for him. It has been good to have another priest here in the parish for the two weeks that I have been here with him.

Imagine that you pick up your mail and find a very special-looking gold envelope nestled in with all the other bills and ads. It contains a formal dinner invitation from God. An RSVP is requested.

Will you attend? What if there is a date conflict—You've accepted another invitation with friends, or have already purchased non-refundable tickets on a Cruise to England? It's the same day as the big game! Or, you may just not feel like getting dressed up.

I am troubled by some-thing I have heard in my church. I am born and raised Catholic and never in my life have I heard anyone tell people not to come to church unless they were "dressed to go to court." I was always told the Lord will accept you as you are. If a person comes to church, should they not be accepted for the faith they have and not the clothes they wear? Padre, if I am wrong please advise, for some reason this worries me quite a bit.

## Dear DDP,

Indeed, people should not be judged based on their clothes. I imagine, though, that this admonition was not given to the homeless who might appear oddly dressed, but to those who have many choices about what to wear. I do think it odd that the person who has a suit or dress they can wear to a nice restaurant. appears in church in shorts and flip-flops. I have celebrated Mass in well-off parishes where the people were careless about how they dressed, and others where they took care about what they wore. I have celebrated Mass in poor parishes, and never once did any of them appear in anything but the best they had.

Our society is more casual now. Still, there are standards of dress in place. The Catholic parish does not often demand standards of dress in church. They leave it to the good judgment of those involved. As a matter of interest, there is a dress code enforced at Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome. I can understand a pastor who wants people to show their respect for God by what they wear, especially if they have a large wardrobe from which to choose.
