## Dear Padre? Who can receive the Eucharist?

Who should not take holy Communion? Everyone at church is confused about it **N.A.**

### Dear N.A.,

A Catholic usually receives holy Communion at or after the age of reason. There is a period of preparation for the sacrament, the celebration of first penance, and then holy Communion. The Eucharist is one of the sacraments of initiation and was originally received right after baptism and confirmation. For adults coming into the Catholic Church, the three sacraments are still given together.

To receive holy Communion worthily, the person must be free of mortal sin. Since baptism takes away sin, the sacrament of the Eucharist was first given after baptism. If a person sins after baptism, then the sacrament of reconciliation is used to take away the sin and make it possible for the person to receive holy Communion.

Each Catholic over the age of reason must judge whether he or she is free to approach communion. Only you and God know your personal sins. The person who is free of mortal sin is free to go to holy Communion. It is good to have a regular practice of reconciliation to keep oneself prepared for holy Communion, but if there is no mortal sin present, it is not necessary to go to confession before every Communion.
