### M & M's

Can you believe that on Tuesday we start the month of November already. 2005 is almost gone and at the end of November we begin a new church year starting with Advent. I believe that this past year has gone fairly well. So far we have not been overly burdened with hurricanes, although we have had some close brushes and some high winds and waves causing a few problems. If we stop and think where we were just a year ago, our islands have made great progress. As I listen to those who have been hit by the last two hurricanes in the US, it is amazing that they expect immediate relief when a hurricane hits. How many of us were without power and water for at least a month if not a lot longer and I do not remember any great complaining. Sure there was the frustration of not having everything you wanted, but it was understood that it all takes time to get things back to normal. Maybe I have grown a little accustomed to the slower pace of our Islands, but I think we handled the aftermath of hurricane Ivan much better than our neighbors to the North with hurricanes Katrina and Wilma. Hopefully this last month will not be like the first month this year.

I have been asked by some of the parishioners who live out towards Rum Point and Cayman Kai if we might change the time of one of our evening masses on Saturday or Sunday evenings to 5:pm instead of 6:pm so that they might be able to get back to that area of the Island a little earlier while it is still light. If you would like to see one of the masses changed to 5:pm drop a note in the collection bags saying which mass you would want changed and if there are enough of you the Parish Pastoral Council will take this issue up at its meeting.

During the month of November we remember all those who have died during this last year. Can you believe that we only had two funerals here at the parish over this last year? One was a still born baby and the other was Leonard Aston Lewis, Elizabeth Brown's father. We will once again have the book of remembrance in the sanctuary beginning on November 2nd so that we can also remember all those in your families that have died over this last year who were not buried from the parish. Please only list those who have died this past year in the book.

This week in our Readings the prophet Malachi and Jesus both warn the priests and leaders of the church to be good examples and not abuse the people. The Catholic Church is in a struggle with this same situation today with the sexual abuse by some priests and the lack of good leadership by some bishops in handling this problem. Also the lack of good "heroes" in our society from government leaders to business leaders to sports heroes who have not been the best of examples. It is not always easy to practice what you preach but as Christians we are held to a higher standard. "God doesn't ask if you succeeded; He asks if you tried." Preach the Gospel with your actions this week.

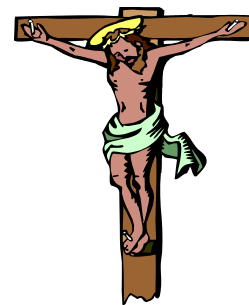

### Dear H.D.,

Jesus will always forgive those who sincerely repent. There are many examples in the gospel, of Jesus forgiving sins. No matter what sins we commit, God does not stop loving us and wanting us to be joined to him. God is always waiting for us to return to him, when we return with sincerity and sorrow, we are forgiven.

Jesus gave us a sacrament, reconciliation, so that our sins could be forgiven. Even if our sorrow for sin is because we are afraid of hell, we can still be forgiven when we confess our sins in the sacrament of reconciliation. There is nothing lost that God is not able to restore to us.

We should receive the sacrament of reconciliation often. We are obligated to receive it when we have committed a mortal sin, but we should try to receive it at other times, too. Jesus always give us grace when we receive a sacrament.

No one should ever be afraid of going to Jesus to ask forgiveness. The cross reminds us that Jesus will go to any length to purify us from sin and open the gates of heaven. We should trust him and his love for us.

### Catholic Customs Contrasted to Halloween

Many of the customs of Halloween have to do with fear of the dead. It was believed by the Celtic people that evil spirits roamed the earth on the last night of the Celtic year (Oct. 31st) and that they worked mischief among the living. Part of the Celtic belief was that one could live safely through the night by dressing up as a ghost, witch etc., or bribing the evil spirits with treats.

In contrast, the Catholic feasts of All Saints Day and All Souls Day offer a much more pleasant opportunity for recognition of our Communion of the Saints or those dead to this earthly existence.

The Catholic Church teaches that the Church exists in three different states. One is the *pilgrim church* struggling to live faithful lives in this earthly existence. Another is the *triumphant church* of saints already in Heaven. The other state is existence in purgatory or the *suffering church*. In purgatory, the faithful are purified for entry into the triumphant church.

The Feast of All Saints Day on November 1 and the Feast of All Souls Day on November 2 reminds us of our relationship to those in the other states. These are days of remembrance, celebration and prayer.
