### M & M's

Over these last few weeks we have experienced a lot of cloudiness and rain. Something that we are not very used to here in the Islands. We expect sun and warmth almost every day and I have heard people say how tired they are of the rain. How amazing that we have one month out of 12 that it is cloudy and rainy and everyone feels depressed. Simon tells me in the office that he feels just like he is at home in Scotland. We do have to be aware that this is not the way the weather is going to be for the next year, and it is with some expectation that we look forward to having the sun back in our daily lives. I find it amazing that we can get tired of something so quick when it really is just a few weeks of the year. A real sign that society still directs our life and tells us we can only be happy when the weather is perfect. I have found this to be a very good time of relaxing, reading and enjoying the cooler weather. Rainy and cloudy days may keep us in but they also give us the chance to catch up on our prayer, our conversations, and our reading. Things we often do not take the time to do because it is sunny and seems to be too nice to do those other things. Take some time to do those other things like reading, praying and sitting and talking with spouses, children and friends.

This month of November is STEWARDSHIP month. We are called to focus on what time, talent and treasure we give to the Lord for all he has done for us.

I want to express a word of thanks to all the parishioners who are actively involved in the various ministries in our parish impacting the lives of hundreds of people, and of those who sacrificially and regularly contribute through their envelopes to the continual support of the church. Who is a steward? They are somebody's manager. We are all stewards of God because Psalm 24 reminds us that God is the sole owner of everything we have. "The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it." St. Peter reminds us of our duty of stewardship: "As each of us has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace." (1Peter4:10). The New Testament refers to our stewardship to God 87 times. Paul claims that he is the steward of Christ's gospel.

As most of us know, there are three areas of stewardship: time, talents and treasure. Accepting the Biblical model of returning 10% of our time for prayer, reflection, and works of mercy and ministry. Here is a breakdown of a normal persons week of 168 hours: work (50 hours), sleeping (50 hours), watching TV (26 hours), eating (15 hours), socializing (8 hours), movies/reading or hobbies (8 hours), shopping (5 hours), exercise or doing nothing (5 hours) religion (1 hour). This is only .6% of our weekly time while Stewardship's target is 16 hours a week of religion. That would mean that we would be praising God and taking time for God more than we take the time to eat. Where do you fall in the amount of time you give to God?

Isn't an archangel an angel who fell from grace and went to hell? I am not sure, but isn't that the story of how the Devil became the Devil? I am confused as we say a prayer to Saint Michael the Archangel in church, so what exactly is an archangel and was the Devil ever an angel at all?

### Dear Maria,

There are nine choirs of angels in heaven. They are: seraphim, cherubim, thrones, dominations, principalities, powers, virtues, archangels and angels. These names appear at various places in the Bible. In some instances, they have particular tasks.

Satan was an archangel whose name was Lucifer. Lucifer means light bearer and Jesus refers to his fall from heaven. Saint Michael was an archangel who fought against Lucifer. Lucifer challenged the dominion of God. Saint Michael, whose name means "Who is like God?" challenged Lucifer and assisted in his fall from heaven. Lucifer wanted to be God and Michael is a reminder that no one is like God.

We traditionally pray to Saint Michael for protection from evil. The fact that Lucifer was an archangel does not mean that all archangels are devils. You may say the prayer to Saint Michael with confidence. At one time it was quite common to pray this after Mass. I hope you find the prayer helpful. You also have a guardian angel to help you in times of trouble. You can also say a prayer to your guardian angel for help.
