M & M's

In the world of business and commerce, the bottom line is profit. And profit is the result of productivity and efficiency. If an operation or a division in a corporation is not efficient and productive, it is eliminated. Heads will roll and let them fall where they may. This world is appropriately described as the "rat race." It is not surprising that some men and women can only take this kind of life for just so long. They drop out, returning to a more relaxed, humane and human kind of living. In fact many of you might be here at Mass precisely for that reason—knowing that within these walls, at least for this hour, you can get away from and forget all about the "rat race."

Consequently you might be upset with or even irritated by our Lord's parable today. After all, isn't the point of the parable efficiency and productivity? Isn't Jesus warning us that we better produce or suffer dire consequences? I know that you parents already have your plates full with your jobs, maintaining your homes, educating your children, being taxi drivers to and from school, sport events, bands, choirs and youth organizations. What you don't need is a lot more stress added to your daily demands.

Of course Jesus does not want to add to your stress and increase your anxiety. The productivity that Jesus holds up for us as an ideal is meant to increase our satisfaction and peace of mind, not stress. Jesus encourages us to keep on doing what we already do. But do it as well as possible and for the right reasons. In this way our activities provide us with a deep level of satisfaction, fulfillment and contentment.

Good and faithful servants are ordinary persons who perform ordinary tasks extraordinarily well. That is the whole criterion of fidelity in a nutshell. Whether these actions are deemed successful or profitable in a "worldly" sense is meaningless. Success means nothing to the Lord, nor recognition.

This week we are asking all of you to be a part of the ministry of the Church. Each of you have talents, and you are called not to waste those talents. When you do nothing then you waste the gifts God has given you and you are like the servant who buried the talents without producing the fruits God expects of you. Jesus is very clear in the parable: God does not distribute talents evenly. Jesus does not defend or explain this decision on the part of God. To dwell on this issue is to miss the point of the parable entirely. The point is: it is not what you have that is important; it is what you do with what you have.

As we share in the celebration of the Eucharist we see that God has given every one of us gifts far beyond what we deserve or merit. The Eucharist is "the gift that keeps giving" and shows there is no limit to God's generosity. When you partake in a ministry in the parish you experience how generous God is to you and how you might be a little generous to God's people here in your own parish.
