## M & M's

You will remember that last weekend some of our youth went over to Jamaica to share in some ministry work there. Tristan Abbot was one of the adult leaders and writes about their trip:

The St. Ignatius youth group arrived back in Cayman on Monday morning after having spent a very blessed three days in Jamaica. The group of 4 adults and 16 teenagers, though initially planning to work with the Missionaries of the Poor and the Missionaries of Charity in downtown Kingston, decided instead to accept the hospitality of the Mustard Seed community as a result of the violence committed against the Missionaries of the Poor a couple of weeks ago. Mustard Seed has a number of homes, some of which are located in areas that are less prone to crime, hence our decision to visit them.

In order to keep ourselves open to the working of the Holy Spirit and to whatever experiences the Lord had in store for us, prayer was made an integral part of the mission. We prayed morning and evening prayer together from the Liturgy of the Hours. We also had mass each day, with Fr. Nash celebrating a private mass for us on Saturday. T.V. was banned as was all music, except for Christian tunes, in order to help keep ourselves focused on the Lord and to allow the students to strengthen their relationships with each other.

Arlette and Francis Fatta, had very kindly offered to house all twenty of us after we discovered that Stella Maris convent (which was our first option for low cost beds) had no rooms available. The house, which was lovely and spacious, was located on the hills overlooking Kingston and offered the perfect environment for the students to relax. They used their down time to expend some excess energy on the large trampoline in the yard, to hang out in the house and chat, to nap and to play pranks on Tristan and Mr. Miller, both of whom gave as well as they got. In fact, it is rumored that the adults pulled more pranks than the students, but there is no real evidence to support these allegations...

On Saturday night, after praying evening prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours, the students shared some of their experiences and thoughts. It was an unusual experience for the group leaders simply in that all the students spoke without prompting. Normally, even with encouragement, it is uncommon for more than three students to offer their thoughts at any one meeting. A number of the young people were amazed at how joyful the orphans were, especially considering their lack of material goods or even the use of all their bodily faculties. This was a true 'reality check', as one put it. Another of the students was impressed by how fully human the disabled children were. The severe mental handicap of many of the orphans can tempt you to think of them as all being the same, but once you get to know them, each little personality begins to shine in a unique and wonderful way. As adults, it was fascinating for us to watch how the young people from Cayman overcame their fears and were able to offer love and comfort to the orphans. By the end of the second day, they were dancing for the children, feeding them, singing to them and sometimes just simply holding their hands. And the little children showed their visitors great love in return and taught them that joy is not necessarily found in the material.

On Sunday we ended the mission by spending the day at Dunn's River Falls. Everyone had a wonderful time, reveling the joy of the Lord, the natural beauty of Jamaica and good friendships! An enormous 'thank you' to everyone who made this mission possible both financially and through prayer. It absolutely could not have happened without your faith and generosity. God bless all of you.

## Dear Padre?

## Do Catholics have to marry in the Church?

If a couple decides to marry outside of the Church are they still allowed to receive Communion and other sacraments?

### Dear Tracey,

One of the obligations Catholics have is to follow the laws of the Church regarding marriage. If a Catholic marries outside the Church, meaning they did not follow Church law, then they may not receive the other sacraments until their marriage has been witnessed by the Church.

A wedding is a ceremony for the couple, but it is also a ceremony for the Church. The Christian community is called upon to witness the ceremony and the bishop, priest, or deacon is called upon to bless the union in the name of the Church. Given time, patience, and compromise, there is no reason for a Catholic to marry outside the Church.

The church can dispense from the form or place of the wedding for good cause, and does so when necessary. When a dispensation from the law is granted, then the person has followed the marriage laws of the Church and is free to receive the sacraments. A wedding is a sacred ceremony in which a sacrament is conferred. While the park may be pretty and the church down the street may be bigger, these are not sufficient reasons to marry outside the Church.

### This Week's Scriptures

*Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17*

*God promises to take care of the flock. God also promises to judge between the sheep and the rams and the goats.*

*1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28*

*At the end of the world, the Reign of God will be obvious, and Jesus will rise above all enemies.*

*Matthew 25:31-46*

*At the end of time, Jesus will see the sheep and goats divided. The division will be based on how each person served those in need.*

The feast of Christ the King is the last Sunday of Ordinary Time. Next Sunday begins Advent, and we begin the new year of the B cycle of readings. So on this last Sunday, we focus on last things-on the end of the world, on the Last Judgment, and on Jesus, who will see the division of the sheep and goats. Ezekiel and Paul both warn us about it, and Jesus' warning is similar. The time will come when each of us must be held accountable for what we have and have not done.

### For Your Reflection

Jesus never really declared himself to be king of anything on earth. But we declare him to be our King. How is Jesus like an earthly king? How is he different from an earthly king? Every so often you read in the paper or see on television that some famous person or religious group is predicting the end of the world. How do you feel when you hear such predictions? Are you concerned? Are you fascinated? Are you troubled? What would you be more afraid of-the sudden end of the world or your sudden death? How do both of these events affect you when you consider their actual possibility?
