First Sunday of Advent, November 27th, 2005

M & M's

This week I am with my family up in Florida. Fr. Bill Russell is here filling in for me. He comes from the Jesuit House in Jamaica. However, he is living with the Archbishop of Kingston with whom he is a good friend. Fr. Bill is originally from the Boston Archdiocese but has been in Jamaica for the last 6 years. This is his first time to the Cayman Islands.

I would like to give you an update on where the US \$10,000 we collected for the hurricanes in September that we sent to join the monies from the Archdiocese of Detroit. Throughout the Archdiocese of Detroit including our parish, the contributions came to about US \$2.5 million. More than \$2 million has been distributed as follows:

\$1 Million to the Archdiocese of New Orleans;
\$750,000 to Catholic Charities Relief Services;
\$500,000 to the Diocese of Biloxi in Mississippi;
\$40,000 to local immigration assistance for those who came to Detroit;
\$15,000 to Catholic Social Services of Wayne County, Michigan;
\$10,000 to Catholic Social Services of Oakland County, Michigan.

The donations leave the Archdiocese of Detroit with \$485,000 of disaster relief donations left to be distributed. Since Hurricane Katrina the archdiocese has helped to collect money to help victims of other disasters, such as Tropical Storm Jeanne, which killed hundreds in Latin America; the Oct. 8th earthquake in Pakistan; and Hurricane Wilma, which hit Mexico and Florida last month.

This week we start a new liturgical year. The beginning of Advent is a time for us to prepare our hearts for the coming of the Lord both in celebrating his Birthday and in his coming again. During this season of Advent let us be aware of the needs of those around us here on the islands.

NOVENA

Beginning on Wednesday evening at 7:pm at St. Ignatius Church our 9 night Novena will commence in honor of the Immaculate Conception of Mary. This Novena will be each night until December 8th. It is one hour long and we share in song, prayers, scriptures, Eucharistic Adoration and some silent time to prepare our hearts for the coming of the Lord. Come and join us for all 9 nights or if you can't make all 9 come for those you can, even if it is just for one night. You will find your heart refreshed and ready to greet the Lord.

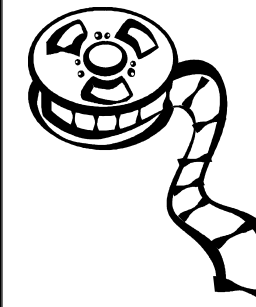

First Sunday of Advent

This week....

We need to be alert to God's calling; we need to be watching for what God wants us to do. We need to be clay for our God to shape and mold so that we can be remade, again and again, in God's image. If we are willing to accept God's way, then God will be with us through it all. We will never be alone, and for that we rejoice and are thankful.

For your Reflection

It is hard to be the clay and to let God be the potter. That's like praying, "Whatever you ask of me, God, I'm willing to do it. I'm all yours. Point the way, and I'm walking it. "It is easier to be the potter and want God to be the clay. That's like praying, "God, please do this and do that; please give me this and give me that." When did you pray as if you were the potter? What happened? How did you feel? Did you ever pray as if you were the clay? If so, what happens? How do you feel? What is the hardest challenge God might ask you to accept? What is so hard about it?

Dear Padre ? Are all sins forgiveable?

A Catholic friend of mine called a friend of ours a name and said she hopes she burns in hell. Can she be forgiven for this? Can she just go to confession and be forgiven?

Dear K. Fey,

It seems we are always surprised by what God can and will forgive. It is important to understand that we have to seek forgiveness. Confession is not a way for us to do any evil thing we want and not have it count against us. Even with confession we are still responsible for any punishment that is due to our sin.

Confession takes away eternal punishment, but we might still be punished for what we have done. Confession requires that we are sorry for what we have done. We are sorry because what we did was wrong, not because we got caught at something. People may do things in anger, as your friend probably did, and then be sorry later. Just as she can ask for the forgiveness of the person she offended, she can ask God for forgiveness.

When we go to confession, we must have a firm purpose of amendment. That means we are not only aware that what we did was wrong, but we are not going to do that thing again. An act of contrition that we make during confession has some statement of amendment in it. Yes, your friend can be forgiven, as anyone can, when their contrition is sincere.
