On Monday of Holy Week there will be a communal penance service at St. Ignatius Church at 6:pm. You are all invited to share in the Sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation for Easter.

In our Gospel today Jesus tells us: "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain, but if it dies, it bears much fruit." In other words what we clutch, what we hold on to tightly, we lose. What we let go of, we gain. What dies, lives. "Those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life from my sake, will find it." (Mt. 16:24).

So many of us have excuses for letting go. We often use the "Yeah, but..." Yeah, but that is in the spiritual sense, you know? Yeah, but Jesus was talking metaphorically, not about life in the real world. Yeah, but Jesus was talking to a simpler people when life was not so complex, or confusing, or dangerous. If this is all true than we need a new Messiah, right?

Don't we see the evidence of Jesus' truth in our everyday lives? Don't we notice that what we clutch, hold on to, we lose.? Don't we notice that when we hold our children too close, we lose them? That when we worry too much about our future, we lose the present? That when we are anxious about our health, we make ourselves sick. That when we finish putting all the bars on the windows and bolts on the doors to protect our freedom, we've fashioned for ourselves little prison? That when we take away liberty to protect ourselves from the enemy, the enemy has already won?

Scary? Of course. Jesus knew our fears. This week let's try to believe the truth of letting go and gaining all and notice what we are most afraid of losing.

This Week...

Being people of God means being people who have faith in life after death. Jesus taught us this with his story of the grain of wheat that dies and then produces new life in its fruit. He also shows us life after death by rising from the dead.

For Your Reflection

Part of growing older is learning how to accept the experiences of loss in our lives, and to have hope in the experiences of growth and new life to come. Experiences of loss could be felt when moving to a new town, after the breakup of a close relationship, or after the death of a friend or relative. Experiences of growth and new life could include meeting new friends in a new town, having a different but honest relationship with someone you care about, or feeling peacefulness in your heart with the memory of someone who has died.

What are some experiences of loss in your life that have been followed by experiences of growth or new life? Jesus said the ones who serve would follow him and the ones who would lose their lives would live forever

What do you think these words of Jesus are all about?

What does it mean to follow Jesus?

What do you think it means to lose life in order to live forever? If you put a seed in the ground, and you water it, does it stay just a seed, or does it turn into something else? What does a tomato seed turn into? How about a pumpkin seed? What about a cucumber seed? Could an apple seed ever grow and become a watermelon? Why not? Have you ever been to a vegetable garden? What was it like? What are your favorite vegetables? Did you ever plant a seed? What kind of seed? What happened? Would a new plant grow if the seed just stayed a seed? Why not?
