Fourth Sunday of Easter– May 7,2006

It has been good having Fr. Paul here for the last two weeks. I hope that you all enjoyed his presence at mass and his friendly and engaging sense of humor. Fr. Paul loves it here in the Cayman Islands and is always willing to come down to help out when I need him. May we keep in prayer Fr. Paul's ministry in Canada where he works with those who have dependency problems.

On Saturday evening we have our Auction "Pennies From Heaven" helping the school keeping its costs down. The night should be a glorious one and I am looking forward to the fun and excitement. I know that it will be done by the time most of you read this and hopefully we will be able to report a successful and fun night.

As many of you know, priests belong to a religious order (such as the Jesuits, the Pallotine's, the Franciscan's) or they belong to a diocese (such as the diocese of Detroit, the diocese of Kingston, etc.). In either case priests are granted faculties to say mass or administer the sacraments by either the Bishop of their diocese or Religious Superior, which allows them to exercise their ministry in a given diocese or a specific ministry. By granting or removing a priest's faculties the Bishop is able to exercise some accountability around the work or ministry of the diocese.

Cardinal Maida informed us and Fr. Graeme Thomson recently that, since he is no longer exercising parish ministry here in the Cayman Islands, that he would not need faculties and therefore they have been removed.

We need to be clear that this decision only affects ministry within the Catholic Church in the Cayman Islands. Obviously Fr. Graeme retains his faculties in his home diocese in England.

We want to express our thanks to Fr. Graeme for all that he has done in helping us out over the last 6 years and pray that he will continue to minister to the needs of those in need.

Today is sometimes called "Shepherd Sunday" because of the Gospel of the Good Shepherd. Shepherds make me think of safety. When I think of Jesus I think of safety. Consider how much energy we expend toward preserving our safety. It is a natural instinct, I suppose, but one that seems to run amuck. We can put locks on our doors, bars on our windows, alarms in our cars, and institute all sorts of national security measures, but are we then safe? Or consider those who suffer in natural disasters—fire, flood, wind, drought. How can we be absolutely safe from these?

We are not only anxious about keeping ourselves safe from enemies or natural disasters, but we put a lot of energy into preserving our comforts. And yet all of us must die, even those with the best security measures or the most things. What if the primary lesson we pass on to our children is not how to balance a checkbook or drive a car or get a good job? What if the primary lesson is not how to get ahead or how to squeeze by or how to avoid getting caught? What if the primary lesson we pass on to our children is how to be good?

How difficult would it be for a week to try to think more about being good than being safe? There is a wonderful quote from *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe* by C.S. Lewis. Aslan is the Christ figure and ruler of Narnia. Upon hearing that Aslan is a lion, the little girl, Lucy, asks if he is quite safe. The Beavers answer her question: "Who said anything about safe? 'Course he is not safe. But he is good. He is the King, I tell you." Jesus is the good Shepherd, how can we all be good shepherds this week.

There are plans to take a group of teenagers from the parish to the Annual Steubenville Atlanta Youth Conference to be held from July 21 to 23.

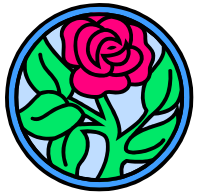
It will be held at the Gwinnett Centre in Atlanta, Georgia.
