### M & M's

"God is love." These three words are so short that banner makers often put them on their creations. They are so familiar that I know one minister used them as what must be the shortest sermon on record: "God is love," he said and sat down. Although his congregation probably appreciated his brevity I am sure that most of you would feel cheated if that was all I said for a homily.

Notice that St. John says, "God is love." Notice that he does not say, "Love is God." John chose his word order carefully. In John's day—as in ours—many people were making love their god: love of power, love of pleasure, love of wealth. The tiny word "OF" is important here; it really means "for": love FOR power, love FOR pleasure, love FOR wealth. But too often such people discover that power, pleasure, wealth do not have much love for them. Indeed, these objects of their love are very selfish gods who show little love in return; in fact, power, pleasure, wealth eventually destroy their lovers. These false gods mock the true God by trying to remake their worshipers in their own image. But this effort ends in death, not in life. As the psalmist says about false gods, "Their makers will come to be like them, and so will all who trust in them." (Ps 115:8).

Our God, the true and living God, is so different. God's love is infinite, everlasting—God is love itself. God's love makes us in the divine image, and it remade us in the image of the risen Son through Baptism. It is God's love, working in us, that makes us God-like; it is God's love that makes us able to love God and each other. "If God has loved us so," says St. John, "we must have the same love for one another" (1 John 4:11).

That is why God loves to change us. That is, God *changes* us by *loving* us. God *loves* us in order to *change* us into more loving people. God increases our love for God and for each other by uniting us to the risen Lord, who remains the clearest proof of God's infinite love for this world. When we discover ourselves loved and changed, we find our hearts filled with love for God and neighbor. But as our love for God and for God's people increases, our love for power, pleasure and wealth decreases. This doesn't happen all at once. God is always loving us in order to change us, and our transformation takes a lifetime. God has not completed the transformation of the Church, nor that of any earthly member of it. God is still working to perfect each of us in love.

Are we helping or hindering that effort? How eagerly do we accept God's transforming love and then change our lives in accord with that love? At Easter, as we renewed our baptismal promises, we reaffirmed our desire to reject false gods and serve the true God. Were we not reaffirming our desire to receive and share God's transforming love?

The more we receive the love of God and share it with others, the more we find ourselves loving God and becoming God-like—for "God is love." We are really God's friends if we carry out Christ's commandment of love. We are really God's friends if we change our lives for the sake of Christ's love and in the service of Christ's love. To those whom God loves to change—that is, those changed by God's love and changing the world by it—God promises the joys of the kingdom of love. St. Anselm voices God's invitation when he says, "Love, and you will receive the kingdom. Love, and you will possess it." If we love God and each other, the kingdom of God's love will be our everlasting possession.

## How can I be a Dear Padre? Better Catholic?

### Dear Chris,

Everybody is going to think I made up this letter, but I can't resist answering it. I think you should start with the basics. That means Mass, Communion, and Confession. This will form the core of your spiritual life. Mass is the worship you do with other believers. You need the strength of their faith and they need yours. Communion is you joining yourself to Jesus and to the community. You will need the strength that sacrament gives you. You should go to Mass and Communion every Sunday and holy day. Confession is your way to keep track of your life and deny sin any power over you. Pick a regular schedule for confession that is helpful to you, perhaps once a month.

You will have to keep studying your faith. Ask your priest for books to read, and join a class in adult faith formation from time to time. You also need to put your faith into practice. Try to pick one thing in your parish where you can make a contribution to serving others. Also, try to pick one thing in your community that will help others. And, of course, pray and find a spiritual guide.

## "WE'RE ALL GOING ON A SUMMER HOLIDAY..."

The "I Need a Substitute Sheet" is in use year round, but in the summer, with so many regular Adorers and Subs going away, more volunteers are crucial to keep the Chapel open and running smoothly.

At this time, we would also remind all Adorers that it is your responsibility to organize a replacement if you are going to be absent. **PLEASE** do not just go off on holiday and assume all will be well! First, make every effort to find a replacement using the usual options: the person who shares your hour; family or friends; regular visitors to your hour; the person who sits beside you at Mass every Sunday! Only if these fail, should you put your name on the "I Need a Substitute Sheet". **And remember, if you use the sheet to find someone, you should be on the look-out in the future for an opportunity to fill in an hour or so for someone else! It's a two-way street.**
