The Priesthood: An overabundant return by Fr. Jim Bilot, Vocation Director, Archdiocese of Detroit

Jesus said, "Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or wife or brothers or parents or children for the sake of the kingdom of God who will not receive an overabundant return in this present age and eternal life in the age to come." (Luke 18:29-30). Jesus spoke these words in response to Peter's statement about what the Apostles had given up in order to follow Jesus.

The "overabundant life" without a doubt, is the life of a priest. If God's generosity cannot be outdone, the generous response of a priest to live a life of service models for everyone the will and the way of Christ. What a priest does in his ministry matters to those with whom he comes in contact.

As the priest serves and gives, so too do others reflect that service that has been modeled for them by their priests. Families who have witnessed the sacrifice of a priest in his ministry cannot do enough to help when asked. Principals and DREs will state that the active presence of the parish priest makes a tremendous difference in the lives of the students. Those who are critically ill are tremendously buoyed and relieved when a priest comes to anoint them, or hear their confessions, and assist in a spiritual healing, even though their bodies are failing them. How many times has the Holy Spirit conveyed gifts of comfort and encouragement through the words of a priest to touch the soul of someone at Mass? Often, a priest is not even aware of how he has been used by God to lift the burdens from others.

It takes broad shoulders to bear what a priest must bear. Christ shows his beloved priest the way to live out their duties in Matthew 11:30: "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves."

Living the abundant life is not without its challenges. The demands on a priest can, at time, be overwhelming. For example, on a priest's day-off when the phone rings with an urgent request, most priests will answer that call—they stand in the place of Christ—and they will not abandon their flock. Their responsibilities are 24/7. It is not a job, it is a lifestyle to which they have been called by God.

Priests are the modern day heroes of our lives. They have to overcome the shortcomings of a few; the negative imaging and constant attacks by the media; and the increased responsibilities placed on them by the decline in the numbers of priests while the Catholic population remains steady or is growing. For the most part, priests are happy in what they do and many will say that what they receive far outweighs what they have given up to become a priest.

June is the month in which fathers are celebrated. Let us celebrate our priests as our spiritual fathers and in some way let them know how much they are appreciated for all that they do for us.

This Week...

Great things happen on mountaintops, and all three readings revolve around the greatness of God and God's love. Moses calls the Israelites to consider the great things done by God, and Paul challenges the Romans to consider the greatness of our Christian heritage. Finally, the conclusion of Matthew's Gospel has Jesus on top of a mountain, sending forth the eleven chosen ones to do great things-to baptize and to teach, and to know that he will be with them until the end of the world.

For Your Reflection

The twelve Apostles are not great people. At the time Jesus commissions them, only eleven remain, because one has committed suicide after betraying Jesus. Peter denies Jesus, Thomas doubts that he has risen, and none of them really understand what Jesus was all about. But they became great because Jesus sent them forth to do great things. They were given a responsibility, and they lived up to it. When have you been given a big job to do? When did someone believe in you? When did you live up to a responsibility, even though you were not necessarily confident in your abilities?

How is it that ordinary people can end up doing great things? When we are baptized, it is done in the name of God as Trinity. We are baptized in the name of a God that has relationship and love as the inner core: "Father, Son, and Holy Spirit."

"Father..." Think of your father, your mother, your grandparents. Think of life, think of being created. Think of the times you have been creative and you formed something out of an idea. This is what our Abba is about. What kind of God is this? Why are we baptized in the name of this God? What does it mean?

"...Son..." Think of yourself as a son or a daughter. Think of yourself as a brother or a sister. Think of yourself as a teacher or student of another. Think of yourself as a friend. This is what Jesus is about. What kind of God is this? Why are we baptized in the name of this God? What does it mean?

"...Holy Spirit..." Think of holiness. Think of power. Think of energy. Think of goodness. Think of the positive force of doing the right thing just because it's the right thing to do. Think of the joy that comes to you when you make the right decision. Think of the harmony of all people joining together to be a support to one another. Think of love. This is what the Holy Spirit is all about. What kind of God is this? Why are we baptized in the name of this God? What does it mean?
