I am happy to report that Fr. Alex Crasta has been approved to come to the Cayman Islands and be an associate priest here in our parish. Fr. Alex comes from India and I am sure will tell you more about his background when he gets here. I am hoping that he will be here within the next two weeks. Fr. Alex will be full time in our parish and will be working with me in ministry throughout our Islands.

The readings for today remind us of two realities of human existence: illness and death. The first reading speaks of death as a result of evil while insisting that God did NOT make death but created all things for life. In the Gospel, Jesus heals the daughter of Jairus and the women afflicted with hemorrhages for a dozen years.

Imitating the Master's care, the church community has always sought to offer support and care for those afflicted with serious illnesses and those facing death. One of the primary forms of that support and care for the sick is the sacrament of anointing, while the primary sacrament for the dying is the Eucharist, called VIATICUM in that situation.

Unfortunately, 34 years after the promulgation of the new rite for the anointing of the sick, many Catholics still operate out of a preconiliar understanding. Many people, Catholic and non-Catholic, still speak of the "last rites: and wait until the last possible moment to call for the priest. Of course, then they are hurt and angry if a priest is not available right when they decide they want one.

Trying to bring people up to date on the church's approach to care of the sick and the dying is difficult because many of them do not participate in our worship here. Yet the problem persists among many who do participate regularly, too, which reminds us of the need for ongoing catechesis in this area. Many different avenues of catechesis are important. What are your children learning about anointing and viaticum? Have you explained this sacrament to them? Have you listened when I have spoken about the sacrament of anointing during my homilies? It is even best to request an anointing before you go into the hospital if you know you are going for surgery or tests. I hope that this September or October we will have a communal celebration of this Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. This is a time when you can bring all who are suffering or just getting older to the church for a special mass celebrating this sacrament.

One Sunday at Mass as the priest was giving his homily, a little baby in the front row suddenly started crying loudly. The mother did her best to pacify the child but nothing worked. So finally she got up and started to walk down the aisle to take the baby out of church. The priest stopped his preaching, and very compassionately called out to the mother, "That's OK, you don't have to leave, the child isn't disturbing me." The young mother turned around and said, "No, but you're disturbing the child!"

Dear Padre ? Why do Catholics use the crucifix?

I was raised a Protestant and upon marriage to a Catholic, I agreed to raise our children in the Catholic Church. One of my Protestant friends asked me, several years ago, a question that I have continued to ponder, but not found an answer. In the Catholic church, nearly all crosses displayed and worn have Jesus on the cross. In the Protestant Church, the cross is most often presented without Jesus. Why does the difference exist?

Dear Bob,

In the early days of the Church, before there was a split between Christians, the cross was displayed without the image of Jesus. For the early Christians, crucifixion was a punishment many had seen and the image was horrifying. Having the cross without a depiction of the crucifixion was sufficient to them.

It would be like putting a picture of a man hanging from a tree in the church. Even today, we would find that uncomfortable. Even more so would we be uncomfortable with any current image of capital punishment as a central image in our church. The early followers of Jesus had the same discomfort.

Over the years, crucifixion ceased as a punishment. The crucifix, the cross with the image of Jesus on it, became the symbol of the sacrifice Jesus made for us. It became a popular image for liturgical artists and many churches displayed the crucifix. After the Reformation, many Protestant churches returned to the earlier custom of displaying the cross alone. Each emphasize the sacrifice of Jesus on our behalf.
