Thanks to Jeremy Rice and all the young people who helped him with VBS. I think the kids got a lot out of studying religion and yet having fun. Is that not the way religion is supposed to be most often? Learning and having fun. Although Jesus had a difficult time in his home town this week in the Gospel, I believe he also had fun teaching and healing all those who heard and experienced him. There is a great modern painting of Jesus laughing and I have always loved that picture because religion should make us happy. If we are not a happy people then we have really missed the point of spirituality.

Here are a couple of stories on how we might be happier.

A husband and wife were getting ready to go to a memorial service for the son of a friend. Their friend's son had been killed in the war. As a memorial to their son, his parents gave a generous gift to the church for a stained glass window. The woman said to her husband, "What a beautiful thing to do." Then she turned to her husband and asked, "What are we going to give?" "What are you talking about?" her husband replied. "We don't need to give anything. Our son came back from the war alive." "That's what I mean," she said. "They lost a son and they are giving a gift of thanks, a memorial to his life. We got our son back, and we don't give anything."

Despite our hurts and disappointments we have much to be grateful to God for. Gratitude, in fact, is the centerpiece of all religion—humanity's first and most basic encounter with God is wondrous gratitude to the great Giver of our lives and all that sustains our lives. A constant spirit of thanksgiving should illuminate every moment of every one of our days and add joy to our lives.

There is a legend that after God had created all of the animals of the earth, the newly-made animals walked around, happily discovering what it was life to be alive and getting used to their new bodies—all except the birds. While the other animals had legs so they could run or fins so that they could swim, the birds could just hop a few steps. They thought God had punished them by giving them these awkward appendages on their shoulders. *Why us?* They wondered. *Why do we have to struggle to get around with these "things" on our backs?* But one bird soon discovered that it could move those "things" on its back, that by flapping them up and down the bird could lift itself off the ground higher and higher and higher into the air. Then another one began to flap its appendages. And then another and another and another. The birds discovered that they could soar into the skies—and no other animal could. The birds discovered that what they thought was a "heavy burden" was actually a wonderful gift from God.

Whether we believe it or not, each of us has been given something unique and special from God that we can use to contribute to the work of creation. Sometimes the very "thing" that we consider to be a handicap or disadvantage—or a cross—may lead us to discover the particular gift we possess. But such grace demands work on our part, the faith to "flap our wings," and a willingness to place our "talents" at the service of others. Our happiness lies not in the degree of our talents but in the dept of our love to use them to build the kingdom of God in our time and place.

This Week...

Like Ezekiel, Jesus is rejected by people too rebellious to listen. Like Paul, Jesus finds that there is power in weakness nonetheless, and he sets out to preach in the towns where people are more open to what he has to say.

For Your Reflection

When Jesus comes back home, his neighbors remember Jesus the kid, and refuse to believe in the talents and gifts of Jesus the adult and prophet. How could it be if you grew up, became famous at your craft or skill, and returned home to discover that everyone who knew you as a child had a hard time respecting you as an accomplished expert in your field? What would you do? How would you react?

How would it be if one of your friends who never seemed particularly gifted in any one area grew up, left town, and became famous for her or his talent and insight and opinions? How would you respond to her or his sudden popularity? How might you feel about this friend?

When Jesus returns to visit his hometown, people are not very supportive. They just have a hard time accepting that the child they knew is now a famous prophet, healer, and speaker. Jesus is so distressed by their lack of confidence in his ability and their lack of trust that he cannot even perform the miracles he wants to.

How does the support of your friends and family affect your own performance level and ability?
