While we await the arrival of Fr. Alex from India we shared in having his provincial superior with us this week. Fr. Vensus George came to visit hoping that Fr. Alex would have been here already. It was good to have him here and share in what he expects for Fr. Alex and that he could physically see what the parish is about even though it is summer and much quieter than usual. Fr. Vensus was impressed with the friendliness of the parish and how welcoming he felt for just the 3 days that he was here. He seemed very happy that Fr. Alex will be coming to our parish. Keep praying that his Visa request comes soon and that he will be here within the week.

This week our scripture reading talk about our commitment to bring the good news to others as Jesus sends out his disciples to proclaim His message. Here is a couple of stories that relate to our commitment to go out to all the world.

Fritz Kreisler (1875-1962), the world-famous violinist, earned a fortune with his concerts and compositions, but he generously gave most of it away. So, when he discovered an exquisite violin on one of his trips, he wasn't able to buy it. Later, having raised enough money to meet the asking price, he returned to the seller, hoping to purchase that beautiful instrument. But to his great dismay it had been sold to a collector. Kreisler made his way to the new owner's home and offered to buy the violin. The collector said it had become his prized possession and he would not sell it. Keenly disappointed, Kreisler was about to leave when he had an idea. "Could I play the instrument once before it is consigned to silence?" he asked. Permission was granted, and the great virtuoso filled the room with such heart-moving music that the collector's emotions were deeply stirred. "I have no right to keep this violin to myself," he exclaimed. "It's yours, Mr. Kreisler. Take it into the world, and let people hear it." By sending each one of us as his messengers and ambassadors to the people around us with his "good news" Jesus gives us the same instruction.

Jimmy Carter, the former president in his autobiography "WHY NOT THE BEST?" shared an incident that made him aware of his lack of witnessing to people. Each year the congregation of Plains Baptist Church held a one-week revival service. In preparation for the week, the congregation would venture into the community inviting non-churched members to the services. As a deacon, Carter always participated in this exercise. Carter would always visit a few homes, read Scriptures and have a prayer, share some religious beliefs and invite them to the revival. Carter wrote: "I was always proud enough of this effort to retain a clear conscience throughout the remainder of the year." One day Carter was asked to speak at a church in Preston, Georgia. The topic he was assigned was "Christian Witnessing." As Carter sat in his study writing and thinking, he decided he would make a great impression upon the audience by sharing with them how many home visits he made for God. He figured in the fourteen years since returning from the Navy he had conducted 140 home visits. As Carter sat there, he began to reflect on the 1966 governor's election. As he campaigned for the state's highest office, he spent sixteen to eighteen hours a day trying to reach as many voters as possible. At the conclusion of the campaign, Carter calculated that he met more than 300,000 Georgians. Sitting in his study the truth became evident. "The comparison struck him—300,000 visits for myself in three months, and 140 visits for God in 14 years!" Are we in the same boat?

In today's Gospel, as Jesus prepares the Twelve to minister in his name, he tells them that they will, indeed, encounter rejection; he also offers them and us a method for dealing with this inevitable aspect of discipleship. "If any place will not receive you ... shake its dust from your feet — as you leave." By this symbolic action, the disciples pledge their willingness to make a new beginning, carrying forward none of the baggage of rejection. It means starting out anew with no trace of anger, resentment or desire for revenge upon those who have chosen not to welcome them or their message.

Amaziah tells Amos to go do his prophetic work someplace else.

✦ [Ephesians 1:3-14](#)

Jesus has redeemed us and our sins are forgiven. We are chosen, and when we hear the word of God and believe, we receive the Holy Spirit.

✦ [Mark 6:7-13](#)

Jesus commissions the Twelve to go out, two by two, as missionaries, with no extra clothes, no food, and no money -- just a walking stick. Their task? To proclaim the Good News to whoever will hear it.

This Week...

This is not easy work we have. We hear the word of God, we believe, and we receive the Holy Spirit. Now the hard part begins. Like Amos, we will be told sometimes to take our religion elsewhere. Like the Twelve, we have no plan and no idea of the future. When we find someone who wants to share our faith, we are to stick around. If not, we are to shake the dust and move on.

For Your Reflection

Jesus tells the Twelve to go out in pairs, so friendship must be important. Jesus doesn't want us to go it alone. Who are your closest friends? What do you like about your friends? What do they like about you?

Jesus tells the Twelve to stay where they are welcome, and to leave when they are not.

Where do you feel welcome? Where is a place you feel safe and secure?

When have you not felt welcome? When have you had to just move on because things were not working out the way you had hoped?

Jesus tells the Twelve not to take any money or extra clothes. They have no plan and no map. They just have to take the risk, trust in their faith, and see what happens. How is that like your life?

Jesus does tell them to take a walking stick -- to support them as they journey.

What gives you support? Do you have a hobby or an activity that gives your life structure and helps you to find meaning?
