## M & M's

Still no news about Fr. Crasta and his Visa. Hope to hear something soon.

Today's Gospel is good for us to hear during this "summer" season. "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while." In a world that equates busyness with success and constant activity with importance, that brings its laptops and cell phones on vacation, that works more hours than thirty years ago, that continually escorts its children away from home, and forever sing-songs, like a mantra, the motto that "there is never enough time" the words of Jesus seem more critical and more compelling than ever. "Come away and rest a while."

Even here on these islands it seems that we do not take the time to come and rest with the Lord. We often tell people who come for vacation that the Cayman Islands is a great place to sit and do nothing. But for those who live and work here, we are finding it more and more difficult to "come and rest." However, this rest is not only necessary for our physical and mental health, but also for our spiritual health. Of course, we know this intellectually, but emotionally we are caught in an addiction—indeed, business and hurriedness and the feelings they produce are addictions. For example, a recent survey shows that 79% of people feel rage towards others, especially when they have to wait. Psychiatrists offer two reasons for this feeling of rage. One is a new kind of self-centeredness that says everyone should make room for me and the other—the one we are interested in today—is caused by trying to cram too much into too little time. That's us. But all things from plants to children, need space and solitude in order to grow and form a center that rises above all that.

We see disconnection more and more in children. The old cliché' is that we must give children "roots and wings" - roots that ground them in a core identity and values that will sustain them in the shifting fortunes of life, and wings that will help them soar to challenges. But today, it seems, all we give them is wings—wings that take them to each and every activity, entertainment, happening, or sports event. They must miss nothing. They are, proudly, like most of their parents, "kids on the go." Hopefully it will turn out otherwise but, if the trend continues, there is the possibility that they may grow up as adults wonderfully able to negotiate the Internet, know the names and histories of the people on *Survivor* and *Big Brother*, be masters of trivia, get good jobs—and then in mid-life, find that they cannot jump the hurdle to the marvelously deeper life that beckons and they may not know how to handle this crisis. Maybe, they might think, as was done in the past, a new "ism," a new religion, a New Age gimmick, a new car, a new drug, a new spouse, will help. So they try them all. But nothing seems to work. The trouble is that they will have basically become alienated from themselves. They will not know quiet, peacefulness, who they really are in God's eyes, because they have been so "active."

How often do you get away on your own for a day? I know that many of you take an hour a day or during the week to spend in the Eucharistic Chapel and that is very good. Have you taken your young child there and taught them to sit quietly? You must prepare them and teach them that it is important to be quiet for an hour, but can your child do that? Sometimes on Wednesdays I go some place on the Island away from all to just be quiet for 4 to 5 hours. How can we hear God speak to us in just an hour when it takes almost all of that hour just to begin to sit quietly. Some of you have probably learned to quiet yourself down quickly, but going to a "lonely" spot and reflecting on God's Word and trying to find your real self takes more than an hour.

Maybe it is time that most of us take advantage of the "lack of things to do" on our Islands and find a quiet space to calm down and get to know one's self better. Start at the Eucharist Chapel for an hour, but then find 4 to 5 hours away, in quiet, to rest with one self.

## *Dear Padre? Does a baptized Christian have the same RCIA procedure?*

If an RCIA candidate has already been baptized and fairly well catechized, can they be welcomed into the Church prior to the Easter Vigil? Also, does someone at that level need to undergo all three stages of initiation?

Dear Peg,

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is not a single ritual, but is formation program. That means it has elements of teaching and practice blended together, along with reflection on your progress and prayer. RCIA has catechesis, which means teaching about the Church. The catechesis explains the dogmas of the Church and why they are required for belief.

The process also includes practicing being a Catholic. Candidates attend Mass, sometimes attend meetings of pious parish organizations, and learn how to participate in the sacramental life of the Church. They are generally introduced into the various ministries that lay people do in the Church, with a view toward helping them choose one in which to participate.

Candidates reflect on their journey into Catholicism with their sponsors, catechists, and priests. Anyone can join an organization and do the things the members of that organization do. Joining the Church, however, means accepting not only the beliefs and practices, but allowing those beliefs and practices to be the central feature of your life.

Parishes can receive baptized Christians into full communion throughout the year. Often, though, they ask those individuals to participate in the journey into Catholicism to give them the time to reflect on their decision. If you have mastered the catechesis, you can concentrate on practice and prayer. The catechetical session can be an opportunity to share your reflection on how Catholicism influences your life.
