This past week I was over in Kingston, Jamaica for a conference on the Pontifical Mission Societies for the Antilles Conference of Bishops. Directors of the Mission Societies meet every year to discuss the importance of the Missions in our world and in the Caribbean Islands. The Papal Nuncio was there, Archbishop Thomas Gullickson, along with Archbishop Burke from Kingston, and Bishop DuFour from Montego Bay and Bishop Vincent Darius from Grenada. It was quite impressive having so many bishops at this conference. There are 20 regions in the Antilles Conference of Bishops. Our region, the Cayman Islands is the only one that does not receive monies from the Pontifical Mission Society since we are financially backed by the Archdiocese of Detroit. This is a good thing that we are not considered mission territory although we are a mission standing alone. But all the other regions are mission territories. What is nice is that all the monies we collect for the mission all stays here in the Caribbean Islands. Last year we collected almost \$20,000 in all the collections that went to missions, the Holy Land, Peter's Pence, and the collection we sent for New Orleans after their hurricane. As a region we received many compliments on what we were able to collect since we are the smallest of all the regions.

The Pontifical Society of the Holy Childhood

The Pontifical Society of St. Peter the Apostle

The Pontifical Missionary Union

The Propagation of the Faith is supported by World Mission Sunday at the end of October. Its aims are to maintain in the Church the Spirit of Pentecost which opened the apostles to the far ends of the earth and made them missionaries; it is the Catholic or universal spirit that belongs to the very nature of the Church. Also to live the universal message of redemption in union with Christ in his Church as the foundation of a common apostolic responsibility. And to participate in the proclamation of the Gospel with the example of one's own life and with the contributions of one's own professional and productive human potentialities, also presented in monetary offerings. Some give to the missions by going to the missions. Some go to the missions by giving to the missions. Both must happen for it to work well.

The Holy Childhood Society addresses itself to children and adolescents in order to awaken their missionary awareness and to support their openness to charity and Christian solidarity. We hope to make this Society a part of the work of our children in our school that they might be able to support other children in the Caribbean Islands.

The St. Peter the Apostle Society is for the formation and education of Priests and Religious. We as a parish have not been very involved in this aspect of the Society and I hope we can begin to see the importance in helping in some way to foster the vocations in the Caribbean Islands.

The Pontifical Missionary Union is the promotion of missionary work and the spread of the missions, not through aid, but through prayer. I would hope that we could all be a part of the missionary union by praying for the missions every day. I encourage all those who take time to pray in the Eucharistic Chapel would say some prayers for the missions during the month of October.

This week I am going to be in Scotland and Ireland as part of my celebration of my 30th anniversary in the priesthood that we celebrated last February 13th. I know that Fr. Alex, O'neil and May will be able to take care of all your needs throughout the next two weeks. Once again thank you to all who shared in your gifts for my 30th anniversary to assist me on this trip.

SCHOLARSHIP APPEAL— A new school year has begun! The St. Ignatius/Dorothy Rice Scholarship Fund has been in existence for the past nine years. The fund was created to allow eligible students to continue receiving a Catholic Education. The annual fee at St. Ignatius are about \$6500 per student. The scholarship fund tries to cover about 15-20% of this for needy families. Last year, thanks to the generosity of parishioners and the sale of Mother's Day/Father's Day cards, we assisted more the 40 children with about CI\$35,000 total. In return for the help the families must volunteer to work at school events during the term. Unfortunately, due to Hurricane Ivan, it has been very difficult to do any fund-raising on the local level over the past two years. At the same time, costs all over the island have risen dramatically, and many families who never previously applied for assistance are now coming forward. Any assistance from the parishioners is always gratefully received. One can never put a price tag on the value of a child's education. Any cheques should be made payable to **ST. IGNATIUS- SAYM.**

WORLD YOUTH DAY 2008

SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA



The St. Ignatius /Christ the Redeemer Catholic Church Community is in the process of planning a pilgrimage for young people from our church and school to the World Youth Day (WYD) 2008 in Sydney, Australia from July 12-21.

The Archdiocese of Detroit has set up a special office to deal with all matters relating to World Youth Day and the parishes within the Archdiocese (including the Cayman Islands).

The Theme for WYD2008 is "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses." Acts 1:8

The estimated cost is \$3,300 US per person. This includes:

- Roundtrip airfare from Detroit-Sydney-Detroit
- World Youth Day registration fees
- Hotel accommodations for 7 days
- Continental Breakfast
- Welcome packet with city maps and pilgrim bag prepared by the welcome committee
- Available WYD representative agent to offer assistance when needed
- Transfer from airport-hotel-airport

*The minimum age is 15+ unless an adult is traveling with that child.
It is open to young adults up to 40 years.*

An initial deposit of \$400 US will be due on November 01, 2006.
