M & M's

Next weekend with Catholics all over the world, we will celebrate World Mission Sunday. Our celebration will center on prayer and sacrifice, offered at the Eucharist, for the missionary task: for the priests, Sisters, Brothers and lay catechists who are helping their people to know the love of Christ through their service in village missions, in small schools, in medical outposts, in orphanages, refugee camps and crowded cities throughout the Caribbean, Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands and South and Latin America.

In today's Gospel reading from St. Mark, our Lord speaks of those who have given up much "for my sake and for the sake of the Gospel." Jesus says that they will receive "a hundred times more in this present age" and "eternal life in the age to come."

Throughout the Caribbean Islands and throughout our world today, missionaries—leaving home and family, and all the familiar, and at times, in difficult and dangerous circumstances—proclaim the Gospel and offer help and hope, and the experience of Jesus' love, to the suffering poor. While we may not be called to travel to a distant land to bring the "good News" of Jesus to the poor, we are called, by our Baptism, to share our faith, to be missionaries. We can do so in prayer and sacrifice. Next Sunday, World Missions Sunday, let us, through our prayers and offerings at the Eucharist, support the service of missionaries throughout the World.

Making a difference on World Mission Sunday: \$25 supports a catechist for a month. Catechists in the Mission speak of faith to those who have never heard the Gospel—and witness to that faith by the very example of their lives. From the mid 1960s through the 1980s the West African country of Guinea experienced uprisings and civil war. The Church itself suffered great persecution, with only two priests left alive after the fighting. During that time, catechists "kept the faith alive." In fact, the sons of these catechists are now priests in this African nation.

\$75 provides for the work of Religious Sisters: Throughout the missions, Sisters and Brothers visit the sick, comfort the grieving. In all they do, they witness to the great love of Jesus. Sister Alphonsa has dedicated her life to helping people living in the slums of Manila in the Philippines come to know the "Good News" of Jesus.

\$100 is help for a mission parish: In mission parishes, the poor find help—and hope. Such is the case in St. Mary's parish in Issanagri in the northern part of Pakistan. There, a local priest, Father Khalid Rashid, and his team of five Religious Sisters and five catechists serve 5,000 Catholics scattered throughout 75 predominantly Muslim villages. There are homes for boys and girls, and a network of schools—a high school and middle school, three elementary schools and five nursery schools. In a country often filled with negative news, this parish in Pakistan is a haven for peace—teaching hearts and minds to love in Jesus' name.

From our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI: "Dear brothers and sisters, may World Mission Sunday be a useful opportunity to understand ever better that the witness of love, the soul of the mission, concerns everyone. Indeed, serving the Gospel should not be considered a solitary adventure but a commitment to be shared by every community. As well as those who are in the front line on the frontiers of evangelization—and I am thinking here with gratitude of the men and women missionaries—many other, children, young people and adults, with their prayers and cooperation, contribute in various ways to spreading the Kingdom of God on earth. It is to be hoped that this participation will continue to grow, thanks to the contribution of one and all."

We will have only one collection next week, at the usual collection time, and it will all go to the Propagation of the Faith on this World Mission Sunday.

Dear Padre?

Why do Catholics Honor Mary so Much?

What do Catholics really believe about the Virgin Mary? Protestants don't seem to understand why we have such devotion to her, and I'm not really sure I do either.

Dear Monica,

In this short space, I cannot give a really complete answer to your questions, since many volumes have been written about the Blessed Mother. There are four dogmas or articles of faith about Mary.

The Immaculate Conception is one of these dogmas. We believe that Mary was preserved from original sin from the moment of her conception. The perpetual virginity of Mary is another article of faith. We believe that God preserved her virginity, even though she conceived by the Holy Spirit and gave birth to Jesus. She was a virgin at the conception of Jesus and remained a virgin her whole life. We believe that Mary is the Mother of God, which is a third dogma about the Blessed Virgin. Finally, we believe that Mary was assumed into heaven, body and soul.

One way to think about Mary is that, like all of us, she had a call or vocation from God. In order for her to fulfill her vocation faithfully, all the elements in these four dogmas were necessary. God, therefore, gave them to her. God always makes sure we have what we need to fulfill our vocation, no matter how extraordinary the vocation or the gifts may be.
