M & M's

Today's reading give us another chance to check on our Stewardship. Who are the two most generous persons in the world? You can easily find the answer to this question as to any other question by going to a search engine on the web. You will learn that the two most generous persons in the world are Bill and Melinda Gates. Some years ago they established a foundation that dispenses one billion dollars a year to children in developing countries. No one else in the world even comes close to matching this level of generosity. Even Murdock's gift does not compare to their's.

In today's Gospel though, Bill and Melinda would not win the praise of Jesus for their generosity. The reason is that the Gates still retain about 50 billion dollars for their personal and professional needs. We admire this couple for their empathy towards the sick and hungry children of the Third World even though they fall short of meeting the Lord's standard for generosity.

In praising the widow's generosity, Jesus stresses that his idea of true generosity has two elements to it: donation and shared life. The minimum requirement for Christian generosity is giving some of what we possess to others in need. The opposite of generosity, of course, is hoarding. Simply accumulating possessions of all kinds that we do not need—land, money, material objects of all kinds—stifles any feelings of generosity that might arise in our hearts. Donating from our abundance does not merit Jesus' praise even though it is surely better than hoarding.

The two widows in today's readings are the heroines held up for our admiration and imitation. Their behavior represents the ideal generosity for us. The two widows not only gave, but their giving represented a giving of themselves as well. When Jesus points out that the widow gave what she actually needed, Jesus is saying in effect about the poor widow: "She works for others as well as for herself. She shares her paycheck with those who have even less than herself." It is too bad we do not know more about this poor widow. Who knows how much she deprived herself because of her generosity?

We can reach the same conclusion about the widow who fed the prophet Elijah. Elijah instructed her to prepare the meal for himself and also for herself and her son. She put the needs of the prophet on a level with her and her son's own needs.

Genuine Christian generosity has to include a sharing of oneself with those who receive the donation. This might be what is behind the phrase we use: "Give until it hurts." If it doesn't cost us in some way, donating, even to the Church, does not in itself qualify as Christian generosity. Good parents usually instill in their children at a very early age a sense of sharing. Sharing with others has its full benefit when the result of giving to others is that we have less for ourselves.

Jesus, of course, is the model of this perfect generosity as the second reading tells us. The author of Hebrews contrasts the sacrifices offered by the high priests with the one sacrifice offered by Jesus. The high priests went to the sanctuary annually and sacrificed an animal. Jesus went to the cross once and offered himself as the sacrifice. Jesus did not just share what he had. He gave himself totally.

In our Eucharist we celebrate this perfect generosity. When we receive the sacred host, which means victim, we join ourselves to Jesus and become victims with him. We hope and pray that our lives will show this kind of generosity to our Church and to all in need.

During Jesus' time, the tiny copper coin referred to as the widow's mite was worth about a half a penny or about one-hundredth of a denarius, which was the average day's wage. Do you give one day's wage to the collection each week or do you even give what you make in one hour.
