These last two weeks of the church year remind us of the "End Times." This should not scare us but encourage us to make sure that we are ready for the "coming of the Lord." Being ready means that we are living our daily life in expectation of the coming of the Lord. Doing good for our families and neighbors, being consistent in prayer life and sharing in the sacraments regularly. If we do this we should be ready for the Lord.

Once again I will be offering a 9 day Novena in honor of the feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8th. The Novena will begin on Thursday evening the 30th of November and continue until the 8th of December. It will last one hour beginning at 7:pm, however we have decided to change Saturday and Sunday, the 2nd and 3rd of December to 4:pm in the afternoon. It gets just a little too hectic to say mass and then go right into the Novena on Saturday and Sunday. As usual we will have music and scripture readings along with two 10 minute silent breaks, a litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary and a reflection on the scripture readings. This is a good time to prepare for Christmas by reflecting on the special readings of Advent and preparing our hearts to celebrate the birth of Jesus. We have had an excellent turnout the last few years and I hope that many of you will take the time to make this Novena a part of your preparation for Christmas.

I am happy that so many of you have taken a book of tickets for our Christmas raffle and are planning on selling the tickets to help in our raising funds for the parish and possibly for the Cayman Brac Church. Whenever you turn in a book of sold tickets for \$225 we will give you a free ticket to put your name on or whom ever name you want on that ticket until we have given 328 of those tickets away. If you need a book of tickets please stop in the parish office and pick one up.

We have a priest visiting from Detroit until the end of this month. Fr. Ray Bucon is spending a few weeks here on the islands. Fr. Ray has been in Afghanistan and Iraq during the last year as a chaplain for the military there. He was also in Cuba for a year at the American Base there. It is good to have him taking a little relaxing time here in the Cayman's.

On Monday evening, the 20th of November, at 6:pm we will be having a Eucharistic Ministers Training in the Church at St. Ignatius. If you would like to be a Eucharistic Minister I encourage you to come to this meeting. The requirements are that you be a practicing Catholic, have a reverence for the blessed sacrament, if married, you must have been married in the Catholic Church, and have received the sacrament of Confirmation. The ministry of Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion is an awe-filled ministry. You are called to bring the Body and Blood of the Lord at the Eucharist liturgy and to the sick and homebound. Also to be a model of the transforming grace of this sacrament. The words of St. Augustine are a good source of reflection: "If you are the body and members of Christ, then it is your sacrament that is placed on the table of the Lord; it is your sacrament that you receive. To that which you are to respond 'Amen' (yes, it is true) and by responding to it you assent to it. For you hear the words 'the Body of Christ' and respond 'Amen'. Be then a member of the Body of Christ that your Amen may be true."

With adding another mass here at 11:am on Sundays it is imperative that we have enough ministers to have communion run smooth and be able to offer to all the Body and Blood of Christ. Please seriously consider being a part of this ministry here.
