### NOVENA TO THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

Beginning this past Thursday evening at 7:pm we started a 9 day novena to our Blessed Mother in honor of the feasts of the Immaculate Conception and Our Lady of Guadalupe. The Novena will last one hour with Scripture, Songs, Reflection, and two 10 minute periods of silence to pray the rosary or silently reflect in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. On Saturday and Sunday the Novena will begin at 4:pm. All other nights at 7:pm. Please come to join us as we begin the Advent Season in preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. The Novena will continue through the 8th of December.

### MARANATHA! "COME, LORD JESUS"

This simple Hebrew word summarizes the faith of the church. We are waiting for the Lord to come again. Early Christians expected the return of the Lord to take place very soon, surely within their lifetime. How surprised they would be to find us, more than twenty centuries later, still waiting! The liturgical season we call Advent, The Coming, offers a rich feast of bible readings for our reflection and growth. Day after day the readings draw us into the mood of hopeful expectation that marked the messianic yearnings of ancient Israel.

At the same time, we know and believe that faith does not call us only to look backward. Advent also inspires us to look toward the Second Coming of Jesus and to prepare both our souls and our world for that glorious moment.

As mysteries will do, all this backward and forward viewing also inspires us to look more deeply into the present moment and to discover the presence of Jesus in the people, places, and events of our everyday lives.

I encourage you to take some time to read the daily readings for advent if you cannot make it to morning mass each day. Each week we put the readings for mass in our bulletin and hopefully many of you take the time to find them in your bible and reflect on the Word of God. This season of waiting is always a difficult time for many of us. We know that we must get ourselves ready for the coming of Christ. Our letters or cards written each day are our prayers. We pour out our musings as to one we love who is to come back. We know that Christ is with us, but we also know that the full presence of the Risen Lord is never totally a part of our consciousness and our actions. Advent brings that presence into our daily lives so that at Christmas we can say that God is more a reality to us than before we began our waiting.

We learn how to wait by meditating on how the people of old waited for the Savior. We become one with them. We learn to pray as they prayed when we read the daily scriptures.

We know that there is a Second Coming, but many do not like to think of that moment. It is important in our personal lives to do so; it is important for this world that we do so. Advent does not let us avoid the realization that the world is transitory and the Christ will come again.

Waiting creatively during Advent requires a time commitment and discipline. We have to get ourselves moving and not expect that it will just happen on its own. Everyone is busy today and many feel too busy. Waiting creatively is a decision to set aside the time to reflect on how we should be using our time well. It takes a new kind of discipline to wait well. Christmas will come, but will you have prepared for it?

### BIBLE STUDY—*The Book of Exodus*

The Parish's Bible Study series will resume on Monday, January 15 at 6:30pm at the St. Ignatius Catholic School.
