I hope that you can keep up the good Stewardship for the parish so that whatever monies we make on the Fund Raiser can go to help build our Church in Cayman Brac. If we keep the collection above 10,000 every week then we will be able to use the monies from the Fund Raiser for our new church in Cayman Brac. Also I ask you to remember the parish at Christmas time. Our Christmas Collection is also like a fund raiser because we do not get taxed on it by the Archdiocese of Detroit. You might consider giving a special gift to the parish at Christmas in thanksgiving for God's blessings on us here in the Cayman Islands throughout this past year. Also, as we come to the end of the calendar year, it is a good time to look at your will and consider adding the parish of St. Ignatius or Christ the Redeemer as part of those who receive either money or property after you have died.
