M & M's

It may come as a surprise to many people that one of the main images in the Bible is that of a wedding. From beginning to end, nuptial imagery shines out from the pages of scripture. In the beginning, the story of creation reaches a crowning moment when God gives Adam and Eve to one another as husband and wife. And at the end of the scriptures, the book of Revelation unveils the New Jerusalem coming down from heaven dressed as a bride adorned for her husband.

Marriage imagery is highlighted in today's scripture readings. In the reading from the prophet Isaiah, God is busy at work restoring the broken relationship he has with his people. Here God is at work, bringing us home so that we will shine like a glorious crown in the hand of the Lord. God's relentless and loving pursuit of his people—ancient Israel and us—reaches its crowning moment when God names us “my delight,” and rejoices in his relationship with us the way a bridegroom rejoices in his bride. While you may have your doubts, God doesn't. For the Lord delights in you. Not even the power of sin and brokenness can stand in the way of God's desire to be with us and rejoice in us. Of course, the only way we can take this word of God's delight seriously is through trust and faith, because we will always have doubts mixed in.

Our Lord Jesus is the fullest embodiment of God's desire to be with us. In today's gospel, even as our Lord says his “hour has not yet come,” he turns water into staggering amounts of good wine so that the joy of the wedding party can continue through the night. This transformation reveals the stunning transformation Jesus has on our lives. Yet even more astonishing is that when Jesus' “hour” does finally come, it comes at the cross. His forgiving and life-giving death and resurrection is the hour when the deepest desire of God for us is revealed. Jesus' death and resurrection hold us reconciled. God's delight in us, “as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride,” is the joy of the wedding party that continues through the night, into a new morning, and eternally.

Speaking of marriages and weddings, next month, for World Marriage Day, we would like to validate some of the marriages in our parish. If you were married outside the church, not by a priest, then the Catholic Church considers your marriage invalid. You should not be receiving any sacraments like communion or reconciliation until you have your marriage con-validated, that is: made valid in the eyes of the church by giving your consent in the presence of a priest. If you are in this situation you should call me at the parish office and set up an appointment so that we can talk about con-validating your marriage.

There are plans for an event to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage with couples from our Parish on the evening of February 10th. All married couple are encouraged to join in and celebrate this very sacred institution. If you are interested, please contact the Parish office for more information.

If you are planning on getting married here in the church or someplace else in the world, this year, you will need to attend our pre-marriage sessions that will take place on March 10th and March 11th. These are the only classes we have until October so please make sure that you sign up now by calling the parish office during the week. If you are getting married here in the parish you need to make an appointment with me or Fr. Alex to set the date for your wedding.

From the 18th to the 25th of January the church calls us to pray for Christian Unity. During your prayer time this week, please pray for the members of the different Christian churches on our Islands.
