They have now finished the inspection and have given a verbal preliminary report to the school and Board of Governors on their findings. It will be later this month when they will give the formal written report that will be published in the island papers. I believe that the report will say that we have a good school here, all indications point to this but the formal report is not out yet and we have to wait until the written report comes out to be certain. There has been some talk that the school failed the inspection. That is not true and I have no indication that the report will say that we are a failing school. I applaud the principals, teachers and staff in their efforts to make our school the best on the island.

THE SCRUTINIES

Next week Sunday at the 8:30am Mass we will celebrate the "First Scrutiny" for those in our catechumenal process who are preparing for initiation at the Easter Vigil. The following Sunday at the 8:30 am Mass we will celebrate the Second Scrutiny and on March 25 at the 8:30am Mass, the Third Scrutiny.

The Scrutinies are also called "Major Exorcisms." As such, they are among the most ancient prayers in the Christian Liturgical tradition. As early as the second century, Christian communities would help those who had been chosen for Baptism to prepare for their initiation by laying on hands and by prayers for protection and deliverance from evil.

Today we continue to celebrate these powerful rituals, convinced that those about to enter into a covenant with God in Christ stand in need of prayers for deliverance and protection. We also understand today that our prayers for protection from evil are not limited to those formally engaged in the catechumenal process. Just as our entire community is called to journey with the catechumens throughout this Lenten season, we recognize the need we all share for freedom from evil and its effects.

Your prayers and your support are important for our sisters and brothers who have been journeying for so many months towards the Sacraments of Initiation. Please continue to hold them in your Lenten prayers the elect who count on you for support in making their faith journey.

Abraham and Sarah, both old and childless, look at the stars and see children and grandchildren too many to count. Peter, James, and John look at Jesus and see him beside Moses and Elijah in a sight too brilliant to stare at for long. If God is on our side, how can we fear whom-ever or whatever is against us?

For Your Reflection

Abraham and Sarah were old and childless, and they longed for children. Descendants, like stars, meant to them a permanent place in history, because their names would be carried on. Today, a "star" is a celebrity, someone with a name that is well known. In fact, people often confuse "stars" with "heroes." Just because a person is famous and well known does not mean that person is a good role model for people.
