## **M & M's**

Thank you to all who came to our Lenten Mission given by Msgr. John Zenz this past week. There were about 100 people each night for his talks and I believe he was well received. Msgr. Zenz shared stories of his priesthood in relation to the Eucharist and how we as Catholics can let the Eucharist that we celebrate each week continue to strengthen us and guide us throughout the week and throughout our lives especially in our own families. I believe we were very blessed to have him speak to us and share his spirituality of the Eucharist with us here on our Island.

Crack! The sound of a teacher's ruler across a desk if a student isn't paying attention. Flashing yellow lights warn us when approaching a dangerous curve. Beep, beep, beep, the alarm clock signals the time to wake up. Doorbells, fire alarms, a kick under the table, - many ways we are called to pay attention to what is happening around us. A burning bush is not the usual way most of us get called to pay attention. Yet this was Moses' invitation to an encounter with a God who called him profoundly into service.

On Ash Wednesday we heard the call to conversion, the trumpet blast and the prophet's proclamation: "Blow the trumpet in Zion! Proclaim a fast, call an assembly, gather the people." Now, halfway through Lent we are again urged to heed this call and reflect on our relationship with God and God's People. Year after year, the season of Lent sets a burning bush before us and invites us into the mysterious encounter with the power of God. We may have long ago washed the cross of ashes from our foreheads but the sign of our lives bear the fruit of that symbol. Our Lenten experience invites us to deepen our decision to make our lives a more fruitful sign of our discipleship.

Today's gospel ends with the familiar story of the fig tree that is not bearing fruit. The landowner tells the gardener to cut it down because it is just wasting land and energy. But the gardener pleads for another chance. The fig tree is given a reprieve, another opportunity to bear fruit. A burning bush is calling us to attention, offering us another chance to bear fruit.

Lent is ripe with symbols of God's call to repentance and conversion. Look around! See the needs of all our neighbors, not just the ones we invite over for tea or to our neighborhood parties. Neighbors include the ones on the sidelines and edges, oppressed by the systems that create privilege for some and deprivation for others. Pay attention to those we exclude each day for these too, are God's cherished children.

Fast from emphasis on differences... Feast on the unity of life.  
Fast from apparent darkness...feast on the reality of light.  
Fast from thoughts of illness...feast on God's healing power.  
Fast from words that pollute...feast on phrases that purify  
Fast from discontent...feast on gratitude.  
Fast from anger...feast on patience.  
Fast from pessimism...feast on optimism.  
Fast from worry...feast on divine order.  
Fast from complaining...feast on appreciation.  
Fast from negatives...feast on affirmatives.  
Fast from unrelenting pressures...feast on unceasing prayer.  
Fast from hostility...feast on non-resistance.  
Fast from bitterness...feast on forgiveness.  
Fast from self concern...feast on compassion for others.  
Fast from personal anxiety...feast on Eternal Truth.

## THE SCRUTINIES

This Sunday at the 8:30am Mass we will celebrate the "First Scrutiny" for those in our catechumenal process who are preparing for initiation at the Easter Vigil. The following Sunday at the 8:30 am Mass we will celebrate the Second Scrutiny and on March 25 at the 8:30am Mass, the Third Scrutiny.

The Scrutinies are also called "Major Exorcisms." As such, they are among the most ancient prayers in the Christian Liturgical tradition. As early as the second century, Christian communities would help those who had been chosen for Baptism to prepare for their initiation by laying on hands and by prayers for protection and deliverance from evil.

Today we continue to celebrate these powerful rituals, convinced that those about to enter into a covenant with God in Christ stand in need of prayers for deliverance and protection. We also understand today that our prayers for protection from evil are not limited to those formally engaged in the catechumenal process. Just as our entire community is called to journey with the catechumens throughout this Lenten season, we recognize the need we all share for freedom from evil and its effects.

Your prayers and your support are important for our sisters and brother who have been journeying for so many months towards the Sacraments of Initiation. Please continue to hold in your Lenten prayers, the elect who count on you for support in making their faith journey.
