I want to thank all who participated in our Parish Planning Meeting on Saturday morning. I believe that we found many ideas that the Parish Pastoral Council will be able to put together to form a 5 year plan for the parish. For those of you who took the time to be there know that it is greatly appreciated.

Once again we were reminded this week of the tragedy of what one life consumed with hatred can do. The killing of students and teachers at Virginia Tech by one man who felt isolated and out of touch is a sickening feeling of the tendency of our society to react with violence. This young man seemed to think that no one loved or cared for him. As of now I don't know if he belonged to any Christian community or religious community, for sometimes it is our communities of faith that do reach out to help those who feel so alone and unloved. When we do not have faith and are not part of a community then so often it is easy to fall into the trap that no one cares. And if no one cares about him then why should anyone care about others. That seems to be the misguided thinking of the lonely and despondent in our society. So then it is easy to kill others because in their mind who is going to worry about them.

How much we are our brothers' and sisters' keepers. And it is important that we search out the lost and the depressed to let them know that they are loved. I believe that is why it is very important for parents to make sure that their college bound children are in some form of a community while they are at university and away from home. I hope that this tragic incident will get universities to bring in more groups that bring students together in faith and in worship to let them know that while they are away from home there is still a community that can care and show them the love that is needed. It is so easy in North America and even in our own Caribbean Countries to feel left out and worthless especially in those maturing years of 18 to 25. We need to do more to reach out to young people to let them know we are there and care about them.

My prayers and I know yours go out to the grieving families who lost a child, a young person in the prime of their lives, killed so innocently. I am sure that every parent who has a child in a university anywhere in the world understands how tragic this loss is. This is a good time to make sure that your child knows that they are loved and to make sure that they have a supportive community around them even at College or University to help them during their time away from home.

Fr. Ray Bucon asked me to express to all those that he met in the parish during his stay here in Grand Cayman and his 7 weeks over in Cayman Brac his gratefulness and a thanks for all your hospitality. Fr. Ray provided sacramental worship for our brothers and sisters in Cayman Brac throughout the season of Lent and the first week of Easter. He found his time on Cayman Brac enjoyable and uplifting. He said that he was never bored over there and that there was enough work for a priest to keep him fairly busy there in Cayman Brac. He spent his last week over here in Grand Cayman before he left on Thursday to go back to Detroit. Fr. Ray has been in the Army Reserves for the USA and spent a year in Cuba at the US base and then 3 months in Afghanistan and 9 months in Iraq and has had this year to relax and recover from the difficult times in his assignments. It was very good to have him here and for him to share so much of his experience of being an Army Chaplain. He will be pastor of a parish on the West Side of Detroit, St. Sabina, beginning in July of this year. May God bless him and guide him in his new assignment.
