### M & Ms

The Jewish religion, from which Christianity has gained its heritage, celebrates many festivals throughout the year. However, there are three main festivals that had to be observed by all Jews as mandated by the Torah. The three Pilgrimage Festivals were: Pesach (Passover), Shavuot (Pentecost), and Sukkot (Feast of the Tabernacles/Booths). These are the times when the Israelites living in ancient Israel and Judea, would make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem, as commanded by the Torah. While in Jerusalem they took part in the various festivities and ritual worship in conjunction with the services of the priests at the Temple in Jerusalem.

With the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem, these celebrations are no longer obligatory, but are still observed today through public holidays. The related passages are read from the Torah on these specific days. Many Jews living in or near Jerusalem also make it a point of duty to attend prayer services at the Western Wall.

Today as we celebrate Pentecost, it is around this time that our Jewish brothers and sisters are celebrating Shavuot. Shavuot is known by many names. It is referred to as: Feast of Weeks (Ex. 34:22, Deut. 16:10), Festival of Reaping (Ex. 23:10), and the Day of the First Fruits (Numbers 28:26).

Shavuot takes place seven weeks after Passover (Easter) and commemorates Moses receiving the Ten Commandments from God following the Exodus from Egypt. It is a tradition that Jews eat dairy products on the festival, as when the Jews were awaiting the arrival of their commandments and were unsure what their new dietary laws would be, they ate only dairy products and vegetables, to avoid eating the meat of any animals which might be forbidden.

Just as the Jews waited for Moses to return to them with the Ten Commandments, so too on the day of Pentecost the Apostles had gathered in the upper room awaiting the coming of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit that came down upon the Apostles on that day of Pentecost, was promised to them by Jesus. (*"These things I have spoken to you, while I am still with you. But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you."* John 14:25-26)

This is also the very same Holy Spirit that is very much a part of our Church and our lives today. The Holy Spirit gives validity to all the Sacraments of the Catholic Church. The Holy Spirit is called upon by the bishop/priest to consecrate the gifts of bread and wine to make them into Jesus' Body and Blood. The Holy Spirit is present in the Oil of the Sick, Oil of Salvation and Oil of Chrism, that were consecrated by the bishop during Holy Week. These three oils are used in the Sacraments of Anointing of the Sick, Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination. It is through the bishop's/priest's reception of the Holy Spirit at his ordination that he has the authority to hear Confessions and also witness marriages. A deacon has also received the Holy Spirit through his Ordination. The deacon may witness weddings and carry out baptisms (adult baptism is usually reserved for the Bishop/priest). A deacon cannot consecrate bread and wine, ordain men, confirm teenagers or adults, hear confessions or anoint a sick person.

God's Spirit is very much alive and at work in our lives. The Holy Spirit is still teaching and leading us to truth as was promised by Jesus.

## Questions and Answers on the Holy Spirit

### Who is the Holy Spirit?

The Holy Spirit is God and the third Person of the Blessed Trinity. The Holy Spirit is also called the Holy Ghost, the Paraclete, the Advocate, the Spirit of Truth, the Spirit of God, and the Spirit of Love.

### From whom does the Holy Spirit proceed?

The Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. The Holy Spirit does not proceed from the Father and the Son by spiritual generation. Only the Son proceeds from the Father by generation. This is one of the mysterious truths that we know only from revelation.

### Is the Holy Spirit equal to the Father and the Son?

The Holy Spirit is equal to the Father and the Son because he is God. Because of the oneness of nature in the Blessed Trinity, the Father is entirely in the Son and in the Holy Spirit; the Son is entirely in the Father and in the Holy Spirit; and the Holy Spirit is entirely in the Father and in the Son. No one of the three divine Persons is outside the other, for none precedes the other in eternity, nor surpasses the other in power, nor exceeds the other in any way. The dwelling of one divine Person in the others is called circumcession.

### What does the Holy Spirit do for the salvation of mankind?

The Holy Spirit dwells in the Church as the source of its life and sanctifies souls through the gift of grace. Although the sanctification of mankind, like all other outward works of God, is performed by all three Persons of the Blessed Trinity, it is attributed to the Holy Spirit, the third Person. The sanctification of mankind is attributed to the Holy Spirit because He is the love of the Father and the Son and because the sanctification of man by grace shows forth God's boundless love.
