Hello St. Ignatius parishioners. For those of you whom I have yet to meet, and for those of you who want to know a little more about me, let me introduce myself. I am Fr. Paul Ballien, your new pastor. I grew up in Union Lake, Michigan, which is about thirty-five miles northwest of Detroit. Although the actual address has been officially changed to White Lake, I still sometimes call it Union Lake. But of course, it seems like they've changed the address, zip code and area code out there so many times, it's almost enough to give oneself an identity crisis.

Just a little bit about my family, my father is still alive and my mother recently passed away last year. They were divorced and my father is remarried. My mom grew up in Petoskey, which is in northern Michigan. Petoskey is a very popular vacation spot for people in the Midwest, especially in the summer. Part of the reason is because the weather is cool there in the summers (in the upper 70s on average), the scenery is beautiful as the town sits on Lake Michigan, and it has a quaint, small town feel to it. I still have relatives that live there, and that is where my mom is buried. Consequently, I still go up there every now and then. My father grew up in Saginaw, Michigan, but eventually he found work in the metro Detroit area shortly after he married my mom. He is now retired from GMC Trucks (he was a sales distribution manager), and he currently resides in Tennessee with his wife.

I also have two older sisters. My sister Ruth lives in Grand Rapids, Michigan, and my sister Jane lives in northern Virginia. Both are married. My sister who lives in Grand Rapids was a real estate agent, and a vice president of a small company that builds homes. She had her first child a little more than six years ago and has since had two more, so she is now a stay-at-home mom. Her husband is a computer consultant. My other sister was working for an environmental engineering firm until she became a mom for the first time. She now has two children ages 10 and 7. Her husband is a Lieutenant Colonel in the Marines. He is one of the operations officers for the new Marine museum they recently built on the Quantico Marine base. He has served in numerous places around the world, including Somalia and Iraq.

As for me, after high school I went to college where I graduated from Michigan Tech with a degree in Medical Technology. Michigan Tech is located in Houghton, which is in the far northwestern part of the state. Winters were especially severe there (or fun, depending upon how you look at it). In January the average temperature is around 12 degrees Fahrenheit (-11 Celsius), and typically they get more than 18 feet (five and a half meters) of snow every winter. Most of the students who attend Michigan Tech study engineering.

After college I moved to Traverse City, and then to Tawas City. In both places I worked in a hospital laboratory as a Clinical Laboratory Scientist (a.k.a. Medical Technologist). I liked what I was doing but I couldn't shake the feeling that perhaps God was calling me to the priesthood. So after resisting the idea for a few years, I reluctantly entered Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit at the age of twenty-five. To my surprise I began to enjoy the seminary. When I first entered, I wasn't sure if I would actually go all the way through and become a priest. But as the years went along, I became more and more confident of my calling. After spending five years in the seminary, I was finally ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Detroit back in May of 1999. St. Paul in Grosse Pointe was my first assignment as a priest. I spent three years there, then another two at Holy Family in Novi as an associate pastor. After that, I became the administrator at St. Edith in Livonia for a year before becoming a pastor at St. Basil in Eastpointe for two years.

And now I'm here. When I got the phone call from the diocese, asking me if I wanted to come here I was a little bit surprised. I just so happened to be in Calcutta, India, visiting with the Missionaries of Charity when my cell phone rang. I only had to think about it for a couple of seconds before coming to the conclusion that this is too good of an assignment to turn down.

One of my favorite hobbies is sports. I have played a lot of basketball and water basketball (which is my current favorite). I also swim, bike, run, golf, lift weights and occasionally play racquetball and squash. In addition, I recently started taking scuba diving lessons in the states, so I expect I will start doing that too.

I am definitely excited to be here, I am looking forward to getting to know you all, and I hope that my time here with you will be a blessing for us all.

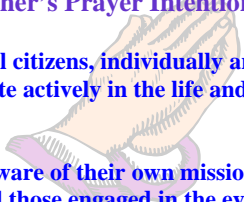
