October 7, 2007 – 27th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

From the **Paul**pit

October 7 is a special day in the church calendar. This day is known as the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary. It was instituted by Pope Pius V (who also happened to be a Dominican) in 1572 as a way of giving thanks to the Blessed Virgin Mary for having delivered Christendom from the Turks through the decisive sea battle of Lepanto.

The history of the Rosary and how it came to be is a little long and fuzzy. But basically it originated from a practice of reciting the 150 psalms, and then eventually over the centuries evolved from there to reciting the Hail Mary. The Rosary as we know it didn't actually take its present form until the sixteenth century, and it was the Dominicans who did the most to foster its devotion and make it a popular practice among the faithful.

The Rosary is important because for one, it seeks Mary's intercession. Mary is a powerful intercessor because she is Jesus' mother, and so as a result he never refuses her anything since Jesus is perfectly obedient to his mother. The Rosary is also beneficial because it helps us to meditate on the life of Jesus and the story of our salvation. Many people do not realize the power that this simple and humble devotional prayer has. But the truth of the matter is that God has given Mary a unique role in the fight against Satan, and it is her humility and obedience that offers the biggest blow towards the arrogance of Satan. Therefore, whenever we pray the Rosary, we enlist ourselves on the side of Mary, set ourselves up in opposition to Satan, and in some way, take on the humble obedient characteristics of Mary herself. This exercise helps place ourselves in her motherly care and ultimately delivers us safely into Jesus' hands. That is why I encourage you to pray this simple and yet powerful prayer. After all, we can all use Mary's help in order to grow closer to Jesus our Savior in connection with the Father and the Holy Spirit.

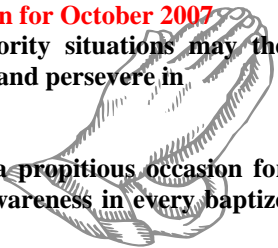

THIS WEEK'S READINGS/GOSPEL: MOVING TREES WITH MUSTARD-SEED SIZED FAITH

Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4—The Prophet Habakkuk cries out to God about the violence and strife all around him. God assures him that the time ending all this will come. Only patience and faith can help Habakkuk endure.

2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14—Paul advises Timothy to bear all hardships with the faith that comes from the Holy Spirit.

Luke 17:5-10—The Apostles ask Jesus to increase their faith, and Jesus replies that if they had faith the size of a tiny mustard seed they could command giant trees to be uprooted and transplanted into the sea.

This Week...

This is a very common theme throughout all the Scriptures- requests for more faith, and help to endure suffering. God is comforting Habakkuk, Paul is comforting Timothy, and Jesus is comforting the Apostles. Where is the source of this faith and comfort we seek? The Holy Spirit.

For Your Reflection...

Jesus is telling the Apostles how small their faith actually is. If their faith were bigger-- as big as the size of a tiny seed, for example- they could command trees to fly through the air and land in the sea! So obviously he must consider their faith to be very small indeed.

How about your faith? Do you think it is large or small?

What influences affect your faith? Has any life experience of yours increased your faith? What happened?

Has any life experience hurt your faith and caused you to have doubts about God? Not only Jesus expect the Apostles to do great things with their faith, but to also see miracles as "no big deal"- - as if they were to say: "It was nothing. We were just doing our job."

Have you ever done anything that impressed someone else, yet you yourself didn't think it was such a big deal?

Have you ever seen someone do something that impressed you, yet to that person it was no big deal?

Do you believe that having more faith- - in God, in yourself, in the power that comes from the Holy Spirit- - could cause miracles to occur?

RCIA DISMISSAL CATECHESIS

Each Saturday at the 6:00pm Mass at St. Ignatius the candidates who are preparing to enter the Catholic Church will take part in the Dismissal Catechesis. This happens just after the homily.

The *Rite of Christian initiation of Adults* reminds the Church to kindly dismiss the catechumens (RCIA 75.3). "The group of catechumens goes out but does not disperse. With the help of some of the faithful, the catechumens remain together to share their joy and spiritual experiences" (RCIA 67 A). They are dismissed to "reflect more deeply upon the Word of God" (RCIA—US 67B) which they shared with the congregation during the Liturgy of the word. The liturgy itself forms and catechizes. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* reminds us that the Liturgy is the privileged home of catechesis and contains rich instruction for the faithful (CCC 1074). Thus dismissed, catechumens engage in mystagogical reflection on the liturgy just celebrated: the liturgical season; the scriptures and their meaning; in dialogue with sound biblical scholarship; the symbols; the rituals; and their own lives. Mystagogical reflection leads to a decision for moral transformation as well as a commitment to share what they have celebrated and received with others.
