## From the Pulpit

A few of weeks ago I indicated that we were going to have a ground breaking ceremony for a new church to be built on Cayman Brac. I am pleased to report that the ground breaking ceremony went very well. Bishop Quinn was able to do the honors of blessing the site, and if I'm not mistaken, there was a picture of Bishop Quinn, Fr. Mike Molnar, and myself with shovel in hand in the Cayman Brac newspaper.

Of course now that means that we need to get busy with trying to finish raising the necessary funds in order to build this church. Therefore, next week we are going to kick off a capital campaign drive by handing out pledge cards at all the Masses. At Mass next Sunday (the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>), we will hand out the pledge cards after the homily, where you will be able to immediately fill out the card if you wish and hand it in the collection basket. You can also take the pledge card home with you if you like and return it at a later time. On the pledge card you will be able to indicate if you would like to pledge just \$2.73 per day for a year, which is \$1,000; \$1.37 per day for a year, which is \$500; or just 68 cents per day for a year, which is \$250, or some other amount of your choosing. You will also be able to indicate if you would like to pay in one lump sum, or monthly over a year's time, or over six months. In addition, you will be given the opportunity to purchase a window, a brick or yet some other part of the church. By letting you know in advance that this is what we will be doing, hopefully you will be able to prayerful consider this week what you might like to give so that its not a surprise when we hand out the pledge cards the following Sunday. I deeply appreciate whatever you can do, as does those who live on Cayman Brac.

Its hard to believe, Lent begins this week. As a reminder, we will be having Mass with the distribution of ashes at 8:30am and 11:00am at St. Ignatius, and 9:45am at Christ the Redeemer in West Bay on Wednesday the 6<sup>th</sup>. It is also important to remember that as Catholics, we are obliged to observe fasting and abstinence on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. We are also obliged to observe abstinence on all Fridays during Lent. According to Canon Law, the law of fasting binds persons from the completion of their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday to the day after their 59<sup>th</sup> birthday. The law of fasting allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food in the morning and evening, or the full meal may be taken in the evening instead of midday. The quantity of food taken at the two lighter meals should not exceed the quantity at the full meal. The drinking of ordinary liquids does not break the fast.

The law of abstinence binds persons from the completion of their 14<sup>th</sup> year, i.e. from the day after their 14<sup>th</sup> birthday throughout life. The law of abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat. Soups flavored with meat, meat gravy and sauces are permitted.

Please check the bulletin about details concerning upcoming events such as World Marriage Sunday on the 10<sup>th</sup>, and special Lenten programs including Stations of the Cross and the fish fry.

## ASH WEDNESDAY

**“Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return”**

Ash Wednesday marks the onset of the lent, the 40-day period of fasting and abstinence. It is also known as the Day of Ashes. So called because that day at church the faithful have their foreheads marked with ashes in the shape of a cross.

Ashes have a long history in biblical and church traditions. In Scripture ashes (dust) symbolize frailty or death (Genesis 18:27), sadness and mourning (Esther 4:3), judgment (Lam. 3:16) and repentance (John 3:6) Some traditions also have considered ash a purifying or cleansing agent.

All these images are caught up in the church's use of ashes as a symbol appropriate for Lent. In Christ's passion we see God's judgment on evil; in our penitence we express sorrow and repentance for our sins; in our rededication we

show that we are purified and renewed.

The ashes used to mark the forehead of the worshipper are prepared by burning palm leaves from the previous year's **Palm Sunday** celebrations and then they are mixed with olive oil. The story behind the use of ashes from the previous year's Palm Sunday goes like, when **Jesus** entered Jerusalem people rejoiced his arrival by waving palm fronds without realizing the he has come to die for their sins. The use of palms from previous year's Palm Sunday is aide memoir of Jesus' death for our sins.

Though not an obligation, the history of Ash Wednesday teaches followers that it is the day to cleanse your mind and soul of sins at the feet of God.

## THIS WEEK'S READINGS/GOSPEL- HUMILITY

**Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13**—The prophet urges us to be humble and to seek justice

**1 Corinthians 1:26-31**—Paul reminds us that God chooses the weak and those considered absurd, to shame the strong and the wise.

**Matthew 5:1-12**—Jesus teaches that those who are happy and most blessed are those who are humble, lowly, merciful, sorrowing, and persecuted.

### This Week....

The message of humility is clearly expressed in all three of these readings. The humble ones are the ones who do not sin and who do not tell lies. The humble ones are the ones who shame the proud ones by their humility. The humble ones are the ones who are the happiest and most blessed.

### For Your Reflection....

The verses of today's Gospel are called the Beatitudes. Sometimes they are called the Be Attitudes because they tell us the kind of attitude we need to develop and the way we need to be.

- Do these beatitudes sound like good news or bad news? Why?
- Who are the most peaceful and contented people you know? What do they have in common with the attitudes of the Beatitudes?
- What are the attitudes of consumerism and materialism? How do commercials and ads encourage people to buy products? How are these attitudes different from those of the Beatitudes?
- What attitudes would make a better world? What attitudes would make a more selfish and self-centered world?
- How could you rewrite the Beatitudes in language that most teenagers today would easily understand?
