## From the Pulpit

I am pleased to announce that we have hired someone for the new position as Head of School, and we have also hired someone for our Head of Primary. Both are Roman Catholic, and both will begin in August of this year. Gary Clarke will be our Head of School. Mr. Clarke is from Ontario, Canada. He had been a teacher for 12 years before becoming a principal for 13 years in both primary and secondary schools. For the last six years he has been working as a Superintendent of Education in Ontario. Mr. Clarke has been married (Elaine) for over 30 years and has three children who are all in their 20s, and all of them I believe are presently working in education.

Andrew Egan will be our new Head of Primary. Mr. Egan is from England and had been a teacher for 14 years before becoming a principal for the last four years. Nevertheless, please consider coming to these events, I am sure it will be very beneficial to your spiritual life.

## “HOW TO AVOID SPIRITUAL DEHYDRATION”

Try journeying across any substantial desert without water. You'll die in a matter of days. Ask the Israelites of our first reading for a testimonial. Physically, water is absolutely vital to functioning. Dehydration is deadly, and it can come on even faster in the desert.

The season of Lent works much the same way. Lent is a desert of the senses— we forego physical comforts such as time (when we take time out to pray), food (when we fast), and material goods and possessions (when we give alms).

Through privation and penance, we strip away the niceties of the material world and get down to the basics of our particularly human existence.

This idea of purification and essential simplicity through penance motivated the aptly named Desert Fathers, the first monks who fled the cities' corruption starting around the third and fourth centuries, seeking to perfect themselves by disentangling themselves from the fleeting and embracing the eternal.

We live in a different age than those ascetics, but we face a similar situation in our observance of Lent. How will we survive and flourish in this self-imposed desert?

We get down to what is absolutely vital for human life and well-being as a whole, without which the spirit that defines us as human will die—and quickly. We read today that this vital element is the living water promised by Christ in our Gospel today—the living water that is faith.

It is the faith, given by God, which saves us and allows us to have eternal life. It is the faith by which Paul says we are justified and by which we access grace, through Christ, in order that we may become perfect. It is the faith which is not lost in times of trouble, unlike at Massah and Meribah. It is a faith in our ultimate happiness—our greatest joy—our salvation.

We cannot continually fall back on our material comforts. That's the point of penance. It is a reality check—how much “stuff” do we really need? But if we are reduced to faith and we find nothing, what then do we have left?

Without faith, our penances mean nothing. Lent becomes a tedious period of meaningless somberness while we wait for an excuse to eat chocolate again or resume whatever we were doing before this time was thrust upon us by the Church.

Our dependence on material things defines our existence, and like them we too will pass away and be unsatisfied. Our spirit becomes dehydrated and is left panting for the only thing that will fulfill its desire.

Lent is not a time to go without; it is a time to grow and drink in that living water and become, in fact, more spiritually alive. It is a time for seeing what our true purpose is and where our true dependence lies—on Christ, His cross, and His grace made known and real to us by faith. It is a time to believe.
