### June 8, 2008– Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

## From the Pulpit

This Wednesday is a special day in the church calendar. June 11<sup>th</sup> is the feast day of St. Barnabas the Apostle. The folk expression for good weather, "Barnaby bright," stems from this feast day because it used to occur on the longest and sunniest day of the year, the summer solstice. That is until of course, the calendar was reformed in 1582 by Pope Gregory XIII, who ordered the advancement of the calendar year by 10 days. The reason for this is because at that time, Europe used the Julian calendar which had been in use since its invention by Julius Caesar (for whom the calendar is named) in 45 B.C. The calendar was quite accurate, it erred from the real solar calendar by only 11 and a half minutes a year. After centuries though, this adds up. And so by the sixteenth century, it had put the Julian calendar behind the solar one by 10 days. Therefore, when Pope Gregory XIII ordered the advancement of the calendar by 10 days, he also introduced a new corrective device to curb further error. Century years like 1800 or 1900 would no longer be counted as leap years unless they were divisible by 400, like the year 1600 or 2000. Thus this new calendar became known as the Gregorian calendar.

Going back to Barnabas, though he was not one of the original twelve Disciples, St. Luke terms him an apostle on account of his having received a special commission from the Holy Spirit. One of his first and most fruitful contributions was to vouch for St. Paul, the recent convert, who was still feared by the other apostles for his previous persecution of the church. Later, Barnabas was sent on a preaching mission to Antioch. As his labors there bore fruit, he sent for Paul to join him. Together they implanted a thriving church. According to the Acts of the Apostles, it was in Antioch that "the disciples were for the first time called Christians."

It was to this worshiping community that "the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul (Paul) for the work to which I have called them.' Then after fasting and praying, they laid their hands on them and sent them off." So Barnabas and Paul set off on the first formal overseas missionary journey, first to Cyprus, and then to the mainland of Asia Minor, where they began reaching out to gentile audiences. In one town their Greek audience was so impressed with the missionaries that they worshiped Barnabas and Paul as the gods Zeus and Hermes. Only with difficulty did the two apostles prevent the crowd from offering them sacrifices.

The successful mission to the gentiles raised the question of whether these new converts must first be circumcised according to the Jewish law. Paul and Barnabas opposed this practice and their argument carried the day at the Council of Jerusalem.

Barnabas and Paul planned to continue their mission, but on the eve of their departure a disagreement arose over whether to include another disciple, John Mark, in their party. Over this disagreement, the two apostles parted. Barnabas, accompanied by John Mark (who is thought to be the same person who wrote the Gospel according to Mark), returned to Cyprus, where eventually he was martyred by stoning in the year 61 A.D.

## RCIA: Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

RCIA, or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, are religious classes designed for adults who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith and for adult Catholics who have not received their first Holy Communion and Confirmation.

Thousands of people convert to Catholicism each year, and they all go through the same procedure.

Our classes are mainly to educate non-Catholics on the fundamentals of Catholicism to prepare people to convert and encounter Jesus in the Sacraments. The RCIA classes are held every week, and the RCIA process includes several steps.

The process provides the opportunity to ask questions to get an idea about Catholicism and learn about scriptures and Jesus Christ.

This is followed by participants accepting Jesus Christ as their savior, and they begin going to Mass on Sunday as they further their commitment to the faith.

During Lent, the six-week preparation time for Easter, participants are then accepted as candidates for the Sacraments (including the Sacraments of Initiation – [Baptism, Holy Eucharist and Confirmation](#)).
