As we celebrate the 10th Anniversary of the opening of the Chapel of the Most Blessed Sacrament, it is good to reflect on some of the biblical reasons for spending one hour with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament:

1. He is really there!

“I myself Am the Living Bread come down from Heaven.” (Jn 6:35)

2. Day and night Jesus dwells in the Blessed Sacrament because of his infinite love for you!

“Behold I will be with you always even to the end of the world,” because “I have loved you with an everlasting love, and constant is My affection for you.” (Mt 28:20; Jer 31:3)

3. The specific way that Jesus asks you to love Him in return is to spend one quiet hour with Him in the Blessed Sacrament.

“Where your treasure is, there is your heart...” “could you not watch one hour with Me?” (Mt 6:21; 26:40)

4. When you look upon the Sacred Host, you look upon Jesus, the Son of God.

“Indeed, this is the will of My Father, that everyone who looks upon the Son believes in Him shall have eternal life. Him I will raise up on the last day.” (Jn 6:40)

5. Each moment that you spend in the Eucharistic Presence will increase his Divine Life within you and deepen your personal relationship and friendship with Him.

“I have come that you may have life, and have it more abundantly.” “I am the Vine and you are the branches. Whoever remains in Me and I in Him shall bear much fruit because without Me, you can do nothing.” (Jn 15:5)

6. Each hour you spend with Jesus will deepen His Divine Peace in your heart.

“Come to Me all of you who are weary and find life burdensome and I will refresh you...” “Cast all of your anxieties upon the One who cares for you...” “My peace is My Gift to you.” (Mt 11:28; 5:7; Jn 14:17)

7. Jesus will give you all the Graces you need to be happy!

“The lamb on the Throne will shepherd them. He will lead them to the springs of life-giving water.” (Rev 7:17)

8. For Peace in our country!

“When My people humble themselves and seek My Presence....I will revive their land.” (2Chr 7:14)

9. Jesus will bless you, your family and the whole world for this hour of faith you spend with Him in the Blessed Sacrament.

“Blessed are they who do not see and yet believe...” “Faith can move mountains...” “What is needed is trust....” Behold I come to make all things new.” (Jn 20:29; Mk 11:23; Mk 5:36; Rev 21:5)

10. Each moment you spend with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament brings joy, pleasure, and delight to His Sacred Heart!

“My joy, My pleasure, My delight is to be with you.” (Prov 8:31)

Dear Padre?

Are all sins forgivable?

A Catholic friend of mine called a friend of ours a name and said she hopes she burns in hell. Can she be forgiven for this? Can she just go to confession and be forgiven?

Dear K. Fey,

It seems we are always surprised by what God can and will forgive. It is important to understand that we have to seek forgiveness. Confession is not a way for us to do any evil thing we want and not have it count against us. Even with confession we are still responsible for any punishment that is due to our sin.

Confession takes away eternal punishment, but we might still be punished for what we have done. Confession requires that we are sorry for what we have done. We are sorry because what we did was wrong, not because we got caught at something. People may do things in anger, as your friend probably did, and then be sorry later. Just as she can ask for the forgiveness of the person she offended, she can ask God for forgiveness.

When we go to confession, we must have a firm purpose of amendment. That means we are not only aware that what we did was wrong, but we are not going to do that thing again. An act of contrition that we make during confession has some statement of amendment in it. Yes, your friend can be forgiven, as anyone can, when their contrition is sincere.

SUNDAY REFLECTION

This Week...

Zechariah the Prophet speaks of a meek savior coming to proclaim peace, without the aid of any weapons of war. Jesus is that gentle Savior who confuses the sophisticated and delights the children. The yoke of Jesus is bearable to those who learn from his humble heart—those who live by the Spirit. Even pains is easier to bear when we know the ways of Jesus.

For Your Reflection...

According to Jesus, children know more about some of God's secrets than do the most clever adults. Have you ever held a crying baby? Have you seen anyone else do it? Can anything be done to stop a baby crying? When the baby finally stops crying, is it because the pain has gone away? How can rocking, singing and cuddling help? AS we grow older, we perhaps don't cry when we skin our knees or drop our toys, but we still have plenty of pain in our life. We never outgrow the ability to hurt or the need for comfort. What might be one of God's secrets about dealing with suffering or about comforting someone in pain? Jesus doesn't promise us life without pain, but he says that the yoke and burden will be light and easy to bear. When have you had to deal with physical pain? What happened? When have you had to deal with great emotional pain? What happened? Which is easier to deal with—physical pain or emotional pain? Why? How does living in the spirit of Jesus affect the way we deal with our pain?

RCIA: Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

RCIA, or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, are religious classes designed for adults who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith and for adult Catholics who have not received their first Holy Communion and Confirmation.

Thousands of people convert to Catholicism each year, and they all go through the same procedure.

Our classes are mainly to educate non-Catholics on the fundamentals of Catholicism to prepare people to convert and encounter Jesus in the Sacraments. The RCIA classes are held every week, and the RCIA process includes several steps.

The process provides the opportunity to ask questions to get an idea about Catholicism and learn about scriptures and Jesus Christ.

This is followed by participants accepting Jesus Christ as their savior, and they begin going to Mass on Sunday as they further their commitment to the faith.

During Lent, the six-week preparation time for Easter, participants are then accepted as candidates for the Sacraments (including the Sacraments of Initiation – [Baptism, Holy Eucharist and Confirmation](#)).
