## From the Pulpit

Greetings from Melbourne, Australia! Twenty of us from St. Ignatius have made the long trek to World Youth Day in Australia, and so for the next couple of weeks I will be reporting on our experiences on this important pilgrimage.

Our pilgrimage began with a seemingly endless flight. From Los Angeles to Melbourne alone was a 15 hour flight. From the time everyone boarded the plane in Cayman until we landed in Melbourne, 34 hours had elapsed. Believe me, no one was up past 8:30 pm the day we arrived, we were all experiencing some jet lag.

When we arrived in Melbourne for the days in the diocese, we met up with our host families for whom we would be staying with while in Melbourne. The couple that I have been staying with along with O'Neil, Juneau, and Yannick are an elderly couple who have been married for 56 years and have lived in the same house for 53 years. They have six children who are all grown and have families of their own. All the people that have been hosting us are down to earth people who have been genuinely welcoming to us and very interested in getting to know more about us. They instantly made us feel comfortable and welcome.

Our first full day in Melbourne we visited the Healsville Sanctuary which housed all kinds of Australian animals like kangaroos, koalas, dingos, wombats and tasmanian devils. We also saw a little bit of the city and countryside. Melbourne is a clean city with a mix of victorian and modern style buildings. The countryside was also picturesque.

The same day we also celebrated Mass and Vespers service with a bunch of pilgrims from France. I had the privilege of celebrating Mass along side the Archbishop of Tours and the Bishop of Chartes at the parish that is hosting us - St. Phillips. Our young pilgrims have really enjoyed meeting other people from all around the world. But what is perhaps most refreshing of all is to see the enthusiasm and joy that the youth have from all over the world in worshipping the Lord. That is why I ask you to please pray for those on this pilgrimage, that their experiences here will leave a lasting impression on them to continually give of themselves over to God.

## RCIA: Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

RCIA, or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, are religious classes designed for adults who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith and for adult Catholics who have not received their first Holy Communion and Confirmation.

Thousands of people convert to Catholicism each year, and they all go through the same procedure.

Our classes are mainly to educate non-Catholics on the fundamentals of Catholicism to prepare people to convert and encounter Jesus in the Sacraments. The RCIA classes are held every week, and the RCIA process includes several steps.

The process provides the opportunity to ask questions to get an idea about Catholicism and learn about scriptures and Jesus Christ.

This is followed by participants accepting Jesus Christ as their savior, and they begin going to Mass on Sunday as they further their commitment to the faith.

During Lent, the six-week preparation time for Easter, participants are then accepted as candidates for the Sacraments (including the Sacraments of Initiation – [Baptism, Holy Eucharist and Confirmation](#)).

## SUNDAY REFLECTION Parable of the Sower and the Seed

### Invitation to reflect.....

A Biblical scholar, C.H. Dodd, offers the classic definition of a parable: At its simplest, the parable is a metaphor of common life, arresting the hearer by its vividness or strangeness, and leaving the mind in sufficient doubt about its precise application to tease it into active thought.

Jesus very often taught the crowds in parables. In this passage he explains to his disciples why he chooses to teach in this way. He even quotes the prophet Isaiah, who was also troubled about the lack in-depth understanding of the people to whom he prophesied. Parables offer deep truth in story form. They allow the hearers (readers) to judge for themselves where they fit in the story.

Jesus is the master teacher. His Word is offered to us. Each person who has heard the word will receive it in his or her own way. Jesus, the sower, generously plants the seed; but the rest is up to us. Only the words of our Lord that are accepted deep within us will have lasting effect. Any person who has worked in a garden to grow flowers or vegetables knows the peril of the seed that does not find itself in good, rich soil.

It's so easy to have good initial intentions to follow the Word of God, but the world is rarely a nurturing place. Trials and temptations confront us daily. Jesus is completely aware of the many pulls and distractions of our lives. He knows the presence and power of evil. He is so painfully aware that even his Good News depends on our acceptance. He sows the seed with love, knowing the greatness of his message. "But blessed are our eyes because they see, and your ears because they hear" (v.16). As difficult as it may be to hold fast to the Word of God, those seeds that take root in our hearts, Jesus assures us, will bring blessings "a hundred or sixty-or thirty-fold" (v.23)

### For Your Reflection.....

- What or who are the rocky ground, thin soil or thorns in my life?
- What seed of God's Word is firmly planted in my heart and significant in my daily life?
- What seed of God's Word needs greater nurturing in my life?
- How can we, as a community, truly hear the Lord's message in our lives and offer it to other people? What specific action will we take?
