## From the Paulpit

The month of October is sometimes regarded as the month of Our Lady because the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary occurs on the 7<sup>th</sup> of this month. The history of the Rosary and how it came to be is a little long and complicated, but basically it originated from a practice of reciting the 150 psalms, and then eventually over the centuries it evolved from there. The use of beads or knotted strings as a device for keeping count of prayers or continuous repetition of biblical passages or other texts was used by some people even in the early church. By the eleventh century, the custom of saying 150 Our Fathers as a substitute for the 150 psalms was widespread among devout laity. This "poor person's breviary" was often divided, as was the Psalter, into three sets of fifty; and the strings of beads used to count them were called "paternosters."

In the twelfth century, as Marian piety increased, the Angelic Salutation from Luke's Gospel was added to these, and soon the words of Elizabeth at Mary's Visitation as well. Gradually, popular piety created "Psalters" dedicated to Jesus or Mary, concentrating the devotee's attention on biblical scenes. Eventually the Dominicans simplified and promoted this practice so that by the sixteenth century, the Rosary as we know it took its present form. The actual Feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary was instituted in 1572 by Pope Pius V (who also happened to be a Dominican) as a way of giving thanks to the Blessed Virgin Mary for having delivered Christendom from the Turks through the decisive sea battle of Lepanto.

The Rosary is important because for one, it seeks Mary's intercession. Mary is a powerful intercessor because she is Jesus' mother, and so as a result he never refuses her anything since Jesus is perfectly obedient to his mother. The Rosary is also beneficial because it helps us to meditate on the life of Jesus and the story of our salvation. That kind of prayer is a very effective means of communication with Jesus as well as Mary, and will only help unite us with God's will.

Many people do not realize the power that this simple and humble devotional prayer has. But the truth of the matter is that God has given Mary a unique role in the fight against Satan, and it is her humility and obedience that offers the biggest blow towards the pride and arrogance of Satan. Therefore, whenever we pray the Rosary, we enlist ourselves on the side of Mary, set ourselves up in opposition to Satan, and in some way, take on the humble obedient characteristics of Mary herself. This exercise helps place ourselves in her motherly care and ultimately delivers us safely into Jesus' hands. That is why I encourage you to pray this simple and yet powerful prayer. After all, we can all use Mary's help in order to grow closer to Jesus our Savior in connection with the Father and the Holy Spirit.

## SUNDAY REFLECTION GOD DEALS FAIRLY WITH US

### Invitation to Reflect....

Here we have a marvelous gospel story that, in itself, leads us to understand more deeply the message of Jesus. How will God deal with us? What can we expect? This story gives us rather stark portrayal.

In verse 34, the text tells us that the vintage are near, literally, "the time of fruit". This suggests to us that, in the Christian life, time is always of the essence. It is always urgent for us to be about the reign of God. The vineyard of which this story speaks, of course, is that very reign.

The allegory here is clear. God has given us this vineyard-and all the tools we need to tend it. The harvest is upon us. Prophets were sent to call us home, but we did not listen to them. But God, faithful to the end, did not give up. Instead, he sent his very own Son. Surely we would listen to him, God thought. But we also rejected.

This is a story about the leaders of God's Chosen People; it is also a story about us. Indeed, the time of the harvest is near. The work of the reign of God falls upon us- and we have all the tools we need to do what God wants. But will we listen to those who speak for God, our modern prophets? Or will we reject them, greedily hoping to have the vineyard to ourselves?

The point is not merely a matter of running a good vineyard. The wicked tenants did that, after all. It is a matter of producing fruit for God that is the central issue here, rather than seeking our own selfish interests. It is easy for us to confuse this. What does God want? God wants respect for all life ;m forgiveness; mercy; for the poor to be fed, the ill nursed, the lonely visited, the imprisoned set free; for us to be generous; to love our enemies; and to take care of the poor. Reading Scripture as a whole, we can plainly see what God wants.

### For Your Reflection...

- When have I been ministered to by other Christians?
- Do I have an inner sense of what God wants for the unborn, for the oppressed, or the imprisoned? Of how God wants me to treat these people?
- How have we, as a community, witnessed God's response to our real needs?
- What work remains if God's reign is to be established in our corner of the world?

### Invitation to Act....

- Go through the Gospel of Matthew from front to back and make a list of different gospel values. Include everything. In your prayer each day, ask the Spirit to help you live one aspect of this gospel value lifestyle.
- Respect Life Sunday is observed the first Sunday of October. Take a concrete step this week to embrace the gospel of life.
- Familiarize yourself with the Church teachings on life issues. Begin with the Gospel of Life (Pope John Paul II)
- Take ten minutes each day this week for time alone with God. Reflect on the fruitfulness of God's reign in your life.
