From the Pulpit

This Monday happens to be a special day in the calendar for Canadians and Americans alike. In the United States, Columbus Day is observed on the second Monday of October because Columbus' first discovery of land in the new world (believed to be San Salvador in the present day Bahamas) occurred on October 12, 1492. In Canada on this same Monday, they celebrate Thanksgiving. Truly this time of year is an appropriate time to recall what we need to give thanks for. And when we stop to think about it, we inevitably come to the conclusion that God has given us much, and so as a result, we also have much to share. Because of this, the call to serve that Christ issued 2,000 years ago along the dusty streets of Jerusalem remains every bit as valid in today's fast paced world.

As Christian stewards of God's gifts, we are accountable for the proper use of the time, talent and income we have received. Over the next few weeks, I am going to ask you to prayerfully consider God's gifts to you, and then evaluate how you are sharing those gifts within our parish community.

Speaking of stewardship, I would like to thank you for generously giving towards the land that we purchased in West Bay for Christ the Redeemer. We raised nearly \$5,000! To refresh your memory, we purchased a little over 16,000 square feet of land for \$50,000. Prior to this collection we owed a remaining \$9,000. I anticipate that we will finish paying this off by the end of the month. Thank you for your generosity.

As happy as I am about this, there is still more to do for the growth of our faith, not only locally, but also even abroad. Next Sunday is World Mission Sunday. World Mission Sunday is an annual Eucharistic celebration for all the missions of the world. Catholic Churches all around the world celebrate World Mission Sunday. The offerings collected on World Mission Sunday are destined for a common fund of solidarity distributed in the Pope's name, by the Society of the Propagation of the Faith among the Missions and missionaries of the world. Therefore, there will be a second collection next weekend, the 18th and 19th of October, for the missions in places like India, the Philippines, Latin America and Africa. In the words of Pope Benedict XVI:

"The human family awaits redemption and true freedom. Violence, poverty, discrimination and injustice plague our world today. St. Paul understood well that only in Christ can humanity find redemption and hope. The mission, therefore, to proclaim "the promise of life in Christ Jesus" (2 Tm 1:1), "our hope" (1 Tm 1:1) is urgent... All are called to proclaim Christ and His saving message: St. Paul said, "Woe to me if I do not preach the Gospel!" (1 Cor 9:16). As the love of Christ led him to travel over the roads of the Roman Empire as preacher and teacher of the Gospel, so too that same love compels us to complete an unconditional dedication to the missionary task... The Pontifical Mission Societies animate and form the People of God from a missionary viewpoint. May the collection that is taken in all the parishes on World Mission Sunday be a sign of communion and mutual concern among the Churches. Finally, may prayer be intensified over more in the Christian people, the essential spiritual means for spreading among all peoples the light of Christ."
