From the **Paul**pit

A big topic of discussion lately among Catholics in the United States these days surrounds the issue of the University of Notre Dame inviting President Obama to give the commencement address at this year's graduation and at the same time, offering to give President Obama an honorary law degree. Bishop John D'Arcy, the bishop of diocese in which Notre is located, has said that he will boycott the event. In a statement released by Bishop D'Arcy he said, "President Obama has recently reaffirmed, and has now placed in public policy, his long-stated unwillingness to hold human life as sacred. While claiming to separate politics from science, he has in fact separated science from ethics and has brought the American government, for the first time in history, into supporting direct destruction of innocent human life... Even as I continue to ponder in prayer these events, which many have found shocking, so must Notre Dame. Indeed, as a Catholic University, Notre Dame must ask itself, if by this decision it has chosen prestige over truth."

Now some people might say, why is this such a issue, inviting the president of your own nation to speak at graduation? The issue at hand is that the Catholic Bishops of the United States issued a directive in 2004 that said that in regards to Catholic institutions, pro-abortion politicians "should not be given awards, honors or platforms which would suggest support for their actions." What Notre Dame is doing therefore is in direct violation of the bishops' directives, not to mention the fact that many feel, and rightfully so, that it undercuts the Church's teachings on pro-life issues. The President of Notre Dame, Fr. Jenkins has stated that this invitation isn't an endorsement of President Obama's views, but the truth of the matter is this: The Church is trying to convey that the abortion/embryonic stem cell research issue isn't just simply one issue among many. Abortion is an extremely grave matter. The Church's teachings about the right to life is a fundamental moral teaching of the faith. If we honor those who oppose us (As President Obama is in extreme opposition to the Church on this issue) on life issues, it gives the appearance that this issue isn't a deal breaker with us, therefore it isn't really quite so grave of an issue after all. Furthermore, now that President Obama has recently signed into law allowing research being done on embryonic stem cells, and Notre Dame is now giving him an honorary law degree, how can one not see it as an endorsement of his views? We can only pray that Fr. Jenkins will have a change of heart, and President Obama as well.

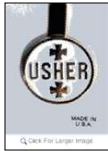

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS

Jesus transforms everything. An instrument of execution and death has become an instrument of life. Jesus did not recoil from his destiny; he recognized that in the cross 'his hour' had come and that his whole life had been a journey to this moment.

So much of Jesus' teaching is taken from observing the natural world. He took note of a principle within a nature that life is born from death. We all understand that in order for a plant to grow, a seed needs first to be buried in the earth. Unless this happens it remains only a single seed- if buried in the soil, then many seeds are produced. Jesus saw his own death mirrored in this process of nature. Jesus knew that his entire life was a preparation for his suffering and death upon the cross. In the history of the world there has never been a more important death, for from his death would come life for the world.

In 1980 Archbishop Oscar Romero was murdered by an assassin's bullet as he celebrated the Eucharist. Moments before, in his sermon, he had said: 'To each one of us Christ is saying: "If you want your life and mission to be fruitful, like mine, do as I. Be converted into a seed that lets itself be buried. Let yourself be killed. Do not be afraid. Those who shun suffering will remain alone. No one is more alone than the selfish. But if you give your life out of love for others, as I give mine for all, you will reap a great harvest."'

Just as Jesus laid down his life, so we are called to lay down our life for others. Just as the cross was Jesus' hour of glory, so we too are called to take up our cross and follow him. Only if we are willing to die to ourselves in this way, we will know the joy of harvest in our lives.

The cross reveals God's love—it makes it plain for all to see. Jesus' cross is the hope of our eternal salvation, our greatest joy and greatest hope. St. Rose of Lima famously said: 'Apart from the cross there is no other ladder by which we may get to heaven.' Pray for the grace this Lent to understand the cross in a new way as the source of all life, all blessing and every grace.
