From the Pulpit

This Tuesday, August 4th, is the feast day of St. Jean Vianney. St. Jean Vianney is somewhat unique among all the canonized saints in the Catholic Church, so let me explain. In the 2000 year history of the Church, 65 of the 266 popes have been canonized as saints. Popes such as St. Gregory the Great, St. Clement, and St. Leo the Great. An even higher number of bishops have been named saints such as: St. Patrick, St. Nicholas, St. Blase, and St. Ambrose. Countless religious priests, brothers and nuns have been canonized as saints such as: St. Francis of Assisi, St. Dominic, St. Benedict, St. Clare, St. Therese of the Child Jesus and St. Teresa of Avila. There are also plenty of deacons that have been named saints. Deacons such as: St. Stephen, the first martyr of the Church, St. Lawrence and St. Vincent. You may be surprised to know that there are even a fair number of lay people who have been canonized as saints. People such as: St. Catherine of Siena, St. Margaret of Scotland, St. Joan of Arc, St. Monica and St. Juan Diego.

If you want to break it down by profession, there are certainly a number of medical doctors and nurses for example that have been named saints such as: St. Luke, St. Anthony Zaccaria, and St. Marura. There are also a number of lay teachers that have been named saints such as: St. Cassian and St. Agatha Lin. There are even at least three lawyers that have been named saints, the most famous being St. Thomas More.

So going back to St. Jean Vianney, what is it that makes him so unique? What makes him unique is this: St. Jean Vianney is the only parish priest to have ever been canonized a saint. Yes its true. There are even more lawyer saints then parish priests. What can I say? It may seem shocking at first (I hope), but perhaps its because parish priests just don't get noticed as much. A more cynical approach would maintain that it's because it is incredibly hard to live according to the standard at which we preach. In other words, we can talk the talk, but can we walk the walk? Feel free to take your pick or come up with your own theory. All I know is that since this year has been named the "Year of the Priest", St. Jean Vianney has been elevated as the patron saint of all priests, and not just the patron saint of parish priests anymore. In retrospect, I am not certain if I should be happy about this. Now that St. Jean Vianney is the patron saint of all priests, who do we have as a patron saint that is specific to us as parish priests? It is not as if we have other parish priests to choose from.

But in all seriousness, St. Jean Vianney was truly a great priest renowned worldwide for his holiness. Train loads of people would come to see him and have him hear their confession. He would spend up to 12 to 16 hours a day sometimes hearing confessions nonstop. That is amazing to me. I am not a stranger to working long hours, but that many hours in the confessional, that is a different story. Three hours in the confessional is enough to drain most priests of their energy.

His life is a reminder to us all of the importance and value of the priesthood, a fact which can sometimes get lost in today's world. This special year for priests coincides with the 150th anniversary of the death of St. Jean Vianney. In memory of him let's renew our efforts to grow in holiness and encourage young people to consider a vocation to the priesthood or religious life. This is important for us to do because such vocations are not only truly noble and worthwhile, but they are even vital and necessary for the sake of the Church and society.

- Are baptized Catholics who have not yet received the Sacraments of First Communion or Confirmation
- Are married to a Catholic and attend Mass and would like to take the next step to become a member of the Catholic Church
- Are Catholic but want to learn more about their Faith

RCIA is a spiritual formation process beginning on September 01st, 2009. RCIA classes are held every Tuesday evening from 6:00pm - 7:30pm.

SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

This Week...

Our faith is forever calling us to be new again. The Israelites have to become new people and live in a completely new way while they are in the desert. Followers of Jesus have to see themselves in a completely new way as they begin to match their life up to the standards Jesus has for them. Paul tells it like it is—we must lay aside our former self and self embrace a fresh, new spiritual self.

For your Reflection....

The people ask Jesus for a sign, like the manna-bread that Moses and their ancestors received in the desert. Jesus tells the crowd that he himself is the "bread of life"

How strong is your faith? Do you feel connected to Jesus and believe he is present to you? Or do you wish you could have more miraculous signs—perhaps like bread falling from the sky?

Jesus recognizes that the people are more concerned with perishable food to fill their stomachs. He urges them to be concerned with the food that will not perish, with food that is eternal and that feed the soul, not just the body.

No one will deny that food for the body is necessary. But most of us never think about eternal food for the soul. What feeds our soul? What feeds yours? What helps your faith? what or who gives life to our relationship with Jesus? What or who helps you believe? How are you're a person who brings "food for the soul" to others?
