From the Pulpit

This past Friday was the feast day of a 20th century saint: Saint Maximillian Kolbe. Maximillian Kolbe grew up in Poland and was ordained a Franciscan priest in 1918. Even from the beginning it seemed as if he was destined for the religious life. When he was just 10 years old, he had a vision in which Our Lady held out to him two crowns, one of white, the other red. The white represented purity, the red, martyrdom. He chose both crowns.

By the time of ordination, he had already begun to implement his idea of a "Militia of Mary Immaculate", which received the blessing of successive popes. He propagated his Marian vision through the press – in particular through *The Knight of the Immaculate*, which was the bulletin of his Militia and was published in a million copies in many languages. He also helped set up towns composed entirely of friars and those dedicated to Mary. The first one, "Niepokalanow", housed 800 religious just before the outbreak of World War II.

When World War II broke out and Poland was captured by the Germans, Maximilian was eventually arrested and sent to Auschwitz. He was housed in Block 14, and when a group escaped from that block, ten men were selected by the Germans for execution. One was a Polish sergeant, and father of a large family. Maximilian, who had not been chosen, offered himself in the sergeant's place. Maximilian died on August 14, 1941, on the eve of the Assumption of Mary. (Information on St. Maximilian Kolbe was taken from Butler's *Lives of the Saints*.)

Speaking of the Assumption of Mary, which we celebrated this past Saturday, this solemnity has important implications for us that many times is overlooked. Not only does it allude to the special role that Mary has played in God's plan for our salvation, the fact that Mary rose body and soul into heaven confirms for us our belief that we too will one day be in heaven with our bodies in a glorified form as well. It confirms for us that the entire human person was meant for redemption, and that our bodies are sacred because they were created and redeemed by God. Consequently, this belief also confirms for us the dignity of the entire human person - body, mind and soul. It confirms that our bodies are not a thing, or a commodity to be owned and used, but instead it is an intrinsic part of the human person that is to be respected as a "temple of the Holy Spirit" as St. Paul would put it. This point of view puts the Catholic Church in stark contrast to the Western World, which more or less has a used and be used mentality when it comes to our bodies. That is why our sexual ethics is so different from the worldview. The intrinsic and sacred value of each and every person in their entirety is upheld in the Church.

RCIA, or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is the process by which people who are interested in learning about the Catholic Faith can attend classes and have the opportunity to become members of the Catholic Church.

RCIA is for adults who:

- Are interested in learning about the Catholic Faith
- Have never been baptized
- Have been baptized in another Christian faith and are interested in the Catholic Faith
- Are baptized Catholics who have not yet received the Sacraments of First Communion or Confirmation
- Are married to a Catholic and attend Mass and would like to take the next step to become a member of the Catholic Church
- Are Catholic but want to learn more about their Faith

RCIA is a spiritual formation process beginning on September 1st, 2009. RCIA classes are held every Tuesday evening from 6:00pm - 7:30pm.

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS

Gospel Summary

As much as Jesus' listeners didn't understand how Jesus could really mean that they were to eat his body and drink his blood, Jesus made it very clear that that was precisely what he did mean. Once again, it was hard for the people of Jesus' day (and still hard for us today, too) to understand what Jesus tried to say because they only thought it earthly, literal terms. This gospel passage gives us one of the firm foundations for the institution of the Eucharist so that, in faith, we will eat the bread that will give us everlasting life.

Reflection for Families

Many times we prepare our children for the big events in their lives forgetting how much of life takes place in the ordinary moments. For example, first communion, is often a big production either at the hands of the priest or how families choose to dress their children and celebrate after Mass. The really important message of this gospel reading, however, is how joyful and thankful are we when we receive our one hundredth or one thousandth communion. Our goal might be to help children continue to be thankful and joyful each time they share in communion. This can happen when they see how happy we are to receive communion ourselves.

Bringing the Gospel into Our Family

After an evening meal this week, talk together about how your family was fed at the meal. Did you affirm one another? Did you listen to the stories told, the events of each person's day? Think about how each person individually and together as a family you were nourished by the food and conversation. See if your family can come up with any similarities to the nourishment of your meal and the nourishment offered us at Mass and in community with others.
