## November 22, 2009 – Our Lord Jesus Christ the King

### From the Pulpit

It is interesting to note that unlike other feast days, the feast of Christ the King was never instituted to commemorate any specific event in Jesus' life. Instead this feast day was instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI to help counteract atheism and secularism. With that in mind, clearly this feast day continues to have great relevance for us today.

One of the dangers of an atheist-secular way of thinking that many people don't stop to consider is the problem of where does our value as human beings come from if it doesn't come from God? The Christian viewpoint is that all human beings are of infinite value because we are made in the image and likeness of God. Furthermore, we have been redeemed through the blood of God's own Son, which only reinforces the idea that God places infinite value on us.

So if God is no longer in the picture, then what do we have left? Where does our value come from? If it doesn't come from God, then it can only come from the world around us. After all, if there is no God, and all we have left is the material world, then things of value can only come from the material world. Therefore, a person is valuable based on what they have or are able to do. As a result, some are more valuable than others. Thus, the effect of this way of thinking has led us to things like abortion or euthanasia. In fact Cardinal Justin Rigali was once quoted as saying this: "Abortion and euthanasia... are the places where those committed to a conditional and selective vision of human rights have planted their flag in our time. They want to draw lines between the important and unimportant members of society, between persons and "nonpersons." In a different time or place the forcing issue might be slavery, racism or anti-Semitism – today abortion and related issues force us to decide whether we mean what we say in speaking of inalienable human rights, inherent in simply being human."

Clearly this atheistic/secularist view reduces the value and meaning of our lives. It essentially says that human beings in and of themselves do not have innate value or meaning. Pope Benedict XVI echoes this sentiment when he had this to say on the issue of how we use our medical technology and what it means for us: "A particularly crucial battleground in today's cultural struggle between the supremacy of technology and human moral responsibility is the field of bioethics. In this most delicate and critical area, the fundamental question asserts itself forcefully: Is man the product of his own labors or does he depend on God? We are presented with a clear either/or. Yet the rationality of a self-centered use of technology proves to be irrational because it implies a decisive rejection of meaning and value."

As I have said before, ideas and beliefs do have consequences on our actions. If Christ is not king of our lives, then something else will take its place. These other things will then direct our thoughts and actions. If we give ourselves to the world, then the world will tell us how to act and what to value. Christianity has a better vision on what our lives really are meant to be about. The reason it is better is because it is the truth. That truth is what frees us and helps us to live happier and healthy lives. Think about it, how depressing is it to believe that we don't have innate value or meaning? The truth frees us from that abyss, the truth that comes from God alone. And that truth is of course is Christ our King.
