January 17, 2010 – Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Miracle of Jesus at Cana

This is a season of "**epiphanies**" in which the Liturgy shows us God's revelation of Jesus as the Messiah to the shepherds, the Magi, King Herod, John the Baptist and those gathered around John at the Jordan. This week we are at a wedding where Jesus reveals his divine power by his first miracle.

Throughout the Bible, marriage is the symbol of the Covenant relationship between God and His chosen people. God is the Groom and humanity is His beloved bride. We see this beautifully reflected in today's First Reading, where Isaiah uses the metaphor of spousal love to describe God's love for Israel.

Symbolic meaning of the miracle as seen by the Fathers of the Church:

= **The fruit of the vine** is used in the Old Testament as an emblem of the joy associated with the Messianic age and a gift and blessing of God (Deut. 7:13; Prov. 3:10, Psalm 105:).

= **The water in the jars** represents the old order of Jewish law and custom (Jeremiah 31:12, Hosea 14:7, Amos 9:13), which Jesus was to replace with something better, namely his sweet and inspiring Gospel.

= The fact that the **abundant wine** (120 gallons) provided by Christ was of such superior quality and taste also reveals the glory, satisfaction, sufficiency, and lavishness of the grace or divine life He provides to sinners.

= Mary's comments, "**They have no wine**" (v. 3) and "Do whatever He tells you" (v. 5), can be understood as a reflection on the barrenness of the Jewish purification rituals and as a directive to look to Jesus as the new means of salvation.

= The **new wine** made by Jesus signifies the "new rich wine" of the Gospel and it points to the "wine of the new covenant" and the "bread of life" which Jesus provides for his disciples in the Lord's Supper or Eucharist. The wine that Jesus had to offer, i.e., his words and works, was far superior to any other teaching or wisdom. It also points to the Messianic banquet, which Jesus will provide at the end of the age when He comes again in glory .

Just as Jesus filled the empty water jars with wine, let us fill the empty hearts around us with love. By the miracle of Cana, Jesus challenges us to enrich the empty lives of those around us with the new wine of love, mercy, concern and care.

Let us appreciate the miracle of the Real Presence of the Lord on the altar. The same Jesus, who transformed water into wine at Cana, transforms our gifts of bread and wine into his own Body and Blood in order to give us spiritual nourishment. Water has been changed into wine. Wine has been changed into blood. Don't be quiet about it. Tell the world: God loves us in ways infinitely beyond our deepest hopes and gives us a gift infinitely greater than our deepest needs.

SUNDAY REFLECTION Jesus Turns Water into Wine

This Week....

There is something wonderful about a union-everyone loves a good wedding story where the two individuals promise to become one flesh, one entity. Isaiah reminds us that God loves us like a bride and groom love each other. But we need to remember that it is the individuality of each separate person that makes each union so enriching. When different gifts from the same Spirit come together and are allowed to grow and to be shared-in a marriage, a friendship, a business partnership, or in a parent-child relationship like Jesus and Mary's- the union is blessed and is made fuller.

For your Reflection....

Jesus isn't interested in listening to his mother at first. But he seems to rethink the situation. After some thought, he goes ahead and does something that she probably would approve of.

When was a time that your mother or father or some older relative was trying to get you to consider an option, and you just didn't want to go along with their idea? But later, when you thought about it, you came to understand his or her point of view and did what he or she wanted you to do? How did it work out?

Jesus' first miracle wasn't splashy. Most people didn't even know what had happened. The waiters kept it low-key and didn't make a big deal about the wine that had just been water in the six jars only moments before. Mary doesn't seem to say anything more about it, and Jesus also plays it cool. Yet the need were met-without a lot of fuss.

When was a time that you took matters into your own hands to take care of a pressing need, but did it in a very low-key way?

Was there a kind of delight to such a secret act of kindness- a kind of self-satisfaction that comes from inside? Why is that?
