From the Paulpit

Next weekend we will be taking up a second collection for the annual Peter's Pence collection. This worldwide collection has a very interesting history behind it. There are various stories surrounding how Peter's Pence first began, but every story traces it back to ancient/medieval England. One story goes back to the late 8th century. In this account, Ethelbert, the king of the East Angles, had reigned for some time without a wife, and thought that it would be a good idea to get married. Therefore, he came to the court of Offa, the king of Mercia, to ask for his daughter, Queenrid in marriage. King Offa agreed. Queenrid, however, was a cruel and ambitious woman who wanted the riches and splendor of the unsuspecting king's wealth all to herself. Consequently, shortly after their marriage she plotted to have her husband killed and hired a scoundrel named Gimbert to help her do it.

Apparently, they accomplished this goal by digging a deep pit and disguising it under the chair of state where King Ethelbert sat. Once he sat in that chair after the pit was dug, he fell into the pit where Gimbert was waiting to finish him off. Three months after this event, Queenrid herself dies. When circumstances convince King Offa of the innocence of King Ethelbert and the wickedness of his deceased daughter, he understandably felt great remorse and guilt. Therefore, to appease his guilt, he built St. Albans monastery, gave one tenth part of his goods to the poor, and went in penance to Rome where he gave the Pope a penny for every house in his dominion.

In another account, according to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, Peter's Pence can be traced back to ninth century England where King Alfred the Great collected money – "pence" or pennies – from land owners as financial support for the Pope. According to Wikipedia however, the first documentary evidence of a Peter's Pence can be found in a letter written from Rome by King Canute to the English clergy in 1031. It was then a levy of one penny on each hearth or household of an annual rental of thirty pence or over.

In any case however, as mentioned before, it can all be traced back to England. This collection has undergone many changes over the years and was eventually established throughout the world. Today, the Peter's Pence Collection supports the Pope's philanthropy by giving the Holy Father the means to provide assistance to those in need. Offerings to this collection go to support church needs such as assistance to seminaries and institutes of Christian formation in many developing countries. It also goes to humanitarian needs such as aid for victims of war, natural disaster, oppression and disease. For example, this collection has gone to help a village for HIV/AIDS orphans in Kenya, and the establishment of the Hospital of St. Vincent de Paul in Bosnia.

The Peter's Pence Collection unites us in solidarity to the Holy See and the universal church in its work of charity to those in need. Your generosity allows the Pope to respond to our suffering brothers and sisters all over the globe with compassion, hope and relief. That is why I ask you to prayerfully consider giving to this worthy cause when we take up the second collection next weekend on the 26th and 27th.
