From the Pulpit

There are a couple of things I wanted to bring up. First of all, the subject of little kids in church. Both of my sisters have, or have had little ones. They are most certainly a great joy, but at the same time they are also a huge responsibility. Even though they can be cute and funny, they can also be just as often loud and demanding. I always marvel at my sisters' patience and dedication as moms because little kids are truly a 24/7 job.

That is why when a little one starts to cry or scream in church, I try not to notice (sometimes I really don't) because I don't want to add to the embarrassment that many parents often times feel when their kids act up in church. Usually, the parents will usher the kids out of the church until they calm down, and that is fine. Certainly I would hope that parents are doing their best to make sure their kids behave in church, not let them run around or make a mess while Mass is going on, and that they would quickly take them outside if they are being really distracting. It is after all imperative that we be respectful to everyone who is trying to listen and participate in the Mass. But at the same time, I would also hope that we all exhibit understanding and patience for those with small children. This is also necessary if we are going to make our parish a warm and inviting place to worship.

The other thing I wanted to bring up is to remind everyone that this Sunday is Remembrance Sunday. Remembrance Sunday is always held on the second Sunday in November to commemorate the contributions of British and Commonwealth military and civilian servicemen and women in times of war and conflict. It is celebrated in conjunction with Remembrance Day, which is on November 11th. Remembrance Day is also known as Armistice Day or Veterans Day in the United States, which also remembers the sacrifices of members of the armed forces, specifically since the First World War. This day specifically recalls the official end of World War I on November 11, 1918 when major hostilities were formally ended on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month with the German signing of the Armistice. The red poppy has become a familiar emblem of Remembrance Day due to the poem, *In Flanders Fields*. These poppies bloomed across some of the worst battlefields of Flanders in World War I, their brilliant red colour an appropriate symbol for the blood spilt in the war. It is good for us to remember them, to pray for peace, and to thank those who gave of themselves and have served in the armed forces; we owe a debt of gratitude to such heroic people.

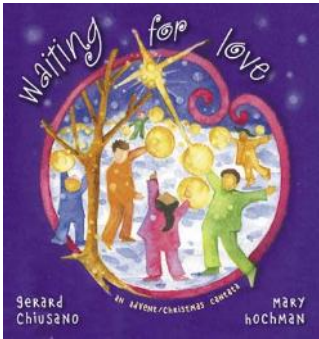
