December 12, 2010– Third Sunday of Advent

From the Pulpit

On December 12th we typically celebrate the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe. This year however, December 12th lands on the Third Sunday of Advent. And so as a result, we are allowed to transfer this feast day to either Saturday the 11th or Monday the 13th. Monday the 13th however, is also a notable feast day, it is the feast day of St. Lucy. St. Lucy was a fourth century Italian martyr. Her name is derived from the Latin word lux, meaning "light," so she has become associated with festivals and celebrations of light. Before the Gregorian calendar reform in 1752, her feast day occurred on the shortest day of the year (Hence the saying: "Lucy light, Lucy light, shortest day and longest night"). St. Lucy Day is especially important in places like Italy and in Sweden where according to tradition, the youngest daughter would put on a crown of burning candles and then wake the family with coffee and St. Lucia buns (sweet rolls seasoned with saffron).

So getting back to the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe, because it is on a Sunday, and the 13th is a feast day of a popular saint, we celebrated the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe at the 8:30 am Saturday Mass, with the closing of the 40 hours devotion. This feast day is significant because it celebrates the apparition of the virgin Mary to an Indian peasant in Mexico. In this apparition, on December 9, 1531, an Aztec Indian whose indigenous name was Singing Eagle and whose Christian name was Juan Diego, set out for the Catholic church near his home, about five miles north of Mexico City. As he neared the hill consecrated to the Mother Goddess of the Aztecs, he heard strange music, then an unnerving silence. Suddenly the silence was broken by a woman's voice calling to him. The maiden identified herself as the "ever virgin, Mary, Mother of the true God who gives life and maintains it in existence." She then expressed her desire for a little house to be built in her honor on the spot and sent Juan Diego with this request to the local bishop.

The bishop, while reportedly courteous, was not prepared to believe word of such an occurrence without proof, and he sent Juan Diego back to get it. The mysterious lady agreed to give the proof on the following morning. The Lady then sent Juan Diego to the top of a hill to gather flowers, to which Juan Diego found some roses growing in the frosty December ground. So he gathered them up, put it in his cloak, then came down the hill to receive the lady's blessing and go off to confront the bishop. When he had gained entrance to the bishop's quarters once more, Juan Diego opened his cloak to let fall the roses. At that moment, an image of the lady was revealed on the inside of the cloak, an image that is revered to this day as the imprint of the figure of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

It is difficult to overstate the impact of this event: an apparition of the Mother of the Christian God to a native of the new land barely ten years after the conquest of Mexico, with the result that a shrine was built on the spot once dedicated to the Mother Goddess. Some say that this event can be said to represent a merging of the European with the American Indian resulting in a birth of a new people. The report is that within six years, nine million natives were baptized. To this day, the image of Guadalupe is enshrined in her church, surrounded by other paintings depicting the cures believed to have been effected through her intercession. Our Lady of Guadalupe is the patron saint of all the Americas.
