## From the Pulpit

There are some things coming up in April that you might want to put in your calendar. First of all, next week we will be doing our mini-novena, or "Pentina" as I like to call it (Yes, I made up that word). It will take place on five consecutive evenings; hence the "Pent" in "Pentina" instead of "Nov" in "Novena" which means nine. The dates of the "Pentina" are April 3<sup>rd</sup> until April 7<sup>th</sup> starting at 7 pm at St. Ignatius. If you haven't been to one of our novenas before, Lent is a great time to go because not only do you get to see what it is all about, but this is also a good opportunity to do something extra for your spiritual life. It lasts for about an hour and includes adoration and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, readings, prayer, hymns, silent time before the Lord in the Eucharist, and of course a short, exciting, fascinating and awe-inspiring homily too. If you can't make it every night, no need to worry, just come when you can.

Another thing worth putting in your calendar is the extra times for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Fr. Alex and I will be hearing confession on Monday, April 11<sup>th</sup>, Tuesday, April 19<sup>th</sup>, and Wednesday April 20<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 pm. We will be available for one hour or until all confessions are heard, whichever comes first. We will also be available for confession on Saturday morning, April 16<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am, and Fr. Alex will also hear confessions on Tuesday, April 12<sup>th</sup> starting at 5:30 pm. In addition, one of us will be hearing confessions at the regularly scheduled time at 5:00 pm on all Saturdays except the Easter Vigil, which is April 23<sup>rd</sup> this year. Please note that the last day confessions are held before Easter Sunday (April 20<sup>th</sup>), tends to be the busiest. So if you want to avoid long lines for the confessional, your best bet is to go before the 20<sup>th</sup>.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is such an important part of our spiritual lives that sadly too many people neglect. In scripture, Jesus told his disciples, "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" (John 20:23). If Jesus gave this sacrament to us, he must have wanted us to make use of it. Clearly Jesus wanted us to go through his Church in order to seek his forgiveness. For myself, I would say that there is something powerful about having to actually say with your mouth what it is that you have done wrong, and hear with your ears that you are forgiven, and then knowing that God has not only forgiven you, but has also given you tremendous grace through the sacrament. When we take this sacrament seriously, and when we are able to give an honest account of ourselves and our lives, it really does help us to grow spiritually and root out sin in our life. Therefore, I encourage you to make use of one of the many times we have made available for confession.

### *Prayer During Lent*

*“Make us worthy, O Lord, by your abundant grace, for the remission of sins and forgiveness of debts on this holy day which is the beginning of Your Holy Fast. Grant us with clean heart, to ask forgiveness from one another, and forgive one another, according to Your Teachings; so that by observing this Fast with purity, we may partake of Your Holy Mysteries in sincerity, our Lord and our God, forever.”*

## SUNDAY REFLECTION

John presents us with a dramatic, even theatrical encounter. Jesus is described in very human terms, sitting at the well, exhausted from his journey. The woman too is very human. Her appearance at the well at about noon, long after the other village women would have replenished their water supply for the day, may indicate her isolated position in local society. She was shunned because of her many sins. Yet it is she who becomes a missionary to her people.

The bad relationship between the Jews and Samaritans was historically conditioned. About 772 BC the Assyrian army descended on northern Israel, took its population into exile and colonized its land with foreigners who partially adopted Israel's religion over the centuries but were always viewed by the original inhabitants as hated, semi-pagan invaders. The woman was therefore very surprised when Jesus spoke to her and even more astonished when he asked her for a drink.

Water becomes the sign by which both baptism and faith are explained to us. Water is the means, but the Holy Spirit flowing into us is the reality. Therefore, there is a vital connection between the flowing of water and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The living water of which Jesus speaks brings not only awareness of her sin to the woman but forgiveness, hope in the person of Jesus as the Messiah, and faith in his words. The water Jesus offers is pure gift of God, water which, when drunk, becomes within a spring of life. Jesus is referring in the first place to his own words of salvation, because whoever listens to them and lives by them will continue to share God's life. The water has a deeper meaning as a symbol of the Holy Spirit (John 7:38-39). The Spirit enables us to understand the words of Jesus and respond to them with a willing heart.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church uses this encounter at the well as a beautiful image in prayer:

*'The wonder of prayer is revealed beside the well where we come seeking water: there, Christ comes to meet every human being. It is he who first seeks us and asks us for a drink. Jesus thirsts; his asking arises from the depths of God's desire for us. Whether we realize it or not, prayer is the encounter of God's thirst with ours.*

*God thirsts that we may thirst for him.'*
