April 3, 2011– Fourth Sunday of Lent

From the Pulpit

I couldn't help but think about pilgrimages this past week, especially since my dad is currently making one in the Holy Land, and Mr. O'Neil Miller is feverishly working on planning and raising money for the pilgrimage to World Youth Day in Spain. As a result, I started thinking about some of the pilgrimages that I had been on in the past. One of them in recent memory was the last trip that I made to India almost exactly four years ago today. This trip actually had elements of a pilgrimage, a mission, and tourism all rolled into one. I traveled with three other people, and while there we visited the tomb of St. Francis Xavier at Bon Jesus church in Goa. We also visited the place where St. Thomas the apostle was martyred in Madras (Chennai), the cave where he hid and prayed (and said Mass); and we also visited the basilica that is built over St. Thomas' tomb. This basilica is only one of three basilicas in the world built over the tomb of an apostle. The other two being St. Peter in Rome and St. James in Santiago, Spain. We were also fortunate to be able to celebrate Mass over the tombs of St. Francis Xavier and St. Thomas the apostle. It was a fabulous experience. We also traveled to Valankanni, which is a very popular pilgrimage spot in India that marks a couple of Marian apparitions that took place there over 400 years ago. Valankanni is sometimes called the "Lourdes of the East."

But one of the biggest highlights of this trip was our visit with the Missionaries of Charity in Calcutta. This is the religious order of course that Mother Teresa founded. At the mother house in Calcutta there were 82 sisters and 102 novices. I was privileged to celebrate Mass with the sisters each morning at 6:00 am. Of course, the sisters were already up an hour or two before hand spending it in prayer before Mass. Then after Mass they eat breakfast and go off to do their various duties of the day. Many of them go to the different "homes" to work. We visited some of them.

The first home we visited was Shishu Bhavan, the home for orphans and abandoned babies. Many of them are eventually adopted. Another home we visited was Prem Ban, which is a hospital for the sick who cannot afford medical care and have nowhere to go. Another home we visited was Kalighat. Kalighat is also known as Mother Teresa's first love. This is a home for the dying. Rather than dying a horrible death on the street with no one to care for them, the sisters have this home to provide a little comfort and dignity for those who have nowhere to turn as they spend their last days on earth. One other place that we visited was a place called Titigarh, which is a leper colony run by the religious brothers branch of the Missionaries of Charity.

It is important to note that not all of India is the same. There are many people there with wealth, and a decent standard of living. There is a growing middle class in India. But while in Calcutta, we saw the poorest of the poor. Despite the sad situation that you saw all around on the streets, the sisters seem to bring a real sense of hope. They seemed to be everywhere as we traveled around. Whenever they were walking or taking a bus to wherever they were going, they would pray a rosary. If you asked them how far a certain place was, they sometimes would say something like, "Oh its about a four decade walk from here." (Or in other words, the time it takes to pray four decades of the rosary.) At the mother house we saw the joy that they had in devoting their lives toward prayer and serving the poor. It was truly inspiring to see, and helps put life into perspective.

During this season of Lent, we would do well to reflect on what is really important. Our faith is meant to have deep meaning and relevance to us. It is faith and love of God that enables the sisters in the Missionaries of Charity to do what they do. Our faith can, and is meant to transform the world. That is why we should make an effort during this season of Lent to direct our focus, and our desires toward the cross of Jesus Christ and his resurrection. That is the cornerstone of our faith. That is our salvation. That is what gives us the answers to life's deepest mysteries. Pilgrimages are meant to help strengthen our faith by helping us to discover that reality and inspire us to live it out. If we allow our faith to take root and grow, then we can change evermore into Christ-centered persons, and our lives then can take on a deeper purpose and meaning that helps bring the glory of God into the world.

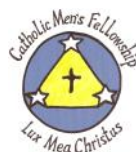

St. Ignatius School 40th Anniversary 4040m Walk/Run This Saturday, April 9th

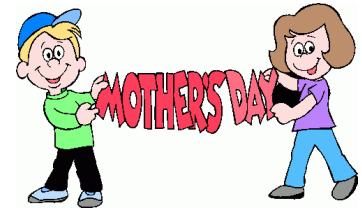

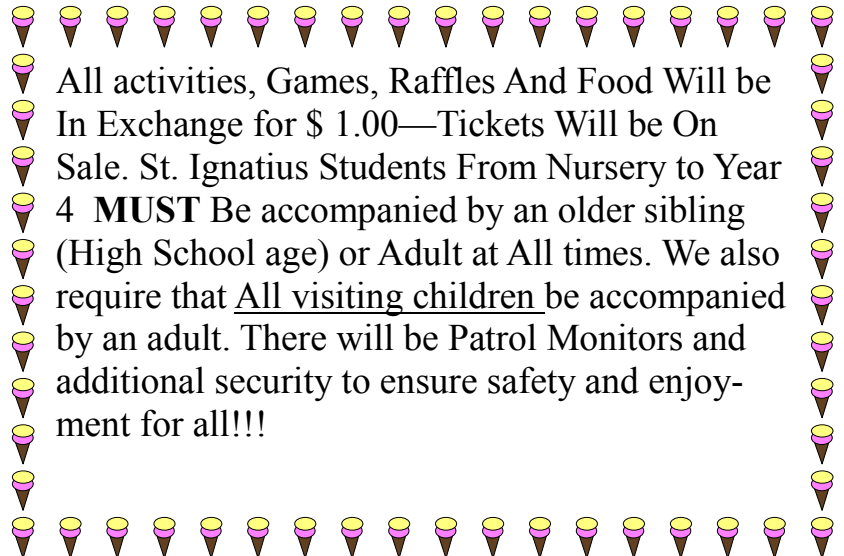
