

FAMILY ENTHRONEMENT TO THE SACRED HEARTS



The devotion to the Sacred Hearts is particularly reserved for the times in which we are now living. All families need extraordinary help to keep love in their homes or to bring it back if it has been lost.

Our Lord appeared to St. Margaret Mary and revealed the “Devotion to His Sacred Heart” in 1673. Jesus gave her 12 Promises for those who “enthroned” their home to him and promise “I will bless the homes in which the Image of My Sacred Heart shall be exposed and honoured”.

The Enthronement of the Sacred Hearts in the home is a proven, effective way of creating the right atmosphere for prayer in the home, for actualising the potential for a stronger Christian family life; to bring all its members closer to the Person of Christ in the Eucharist.

Through this ceremony the authority of the Sacred Hearts as King & Queen are recognized in the family and home. This will help to bring about a greater union of hearts in the family, a greater love between the Hearts of Jesus and Mary with every member of the family and, of course, between the hearts of parents and children.

The Enthronement process spans one week, from Saturday to Saturday (as this is the day of the week specially dedicated to Mary). The Servants of the Sacred Hearts will bring Our Lady of Fatima to your home where some opening prayers will be recited with the family. Our Blessed Mother remains with the family for the week and the following Saturday, the Servants return for the Enthronement of the Two Hearts and the closing prayers.
